It is planned to complete the spring line painting and then assess conditions of parking lots and if fall line painting is required, it could be managed through a possible change order or additional tender.

The company failed to meet delivery requirements and therefore the contract is defaulted. As a result, it is recommended the contract be awarded to the next compliant bidder.

# 15-04-261 <u>St. John's Urban Region Regional Plan 1976 Amendment No. 3, 2014</u> Digital Map Consolidation

For the information of the public, the above-noted amendment was published in the Gazette and brought into effect on Thursday, April 3, 2015. The electronic map is available at <a href="http://miga.gov.nl.ca/consultations/siplan/sjurrp">http://miga.gov.nl.ca/consultations/siplan/sjurrp</a> amend 3 nov.pdf.

As a result of this amendment, all lands above the 190 m contour within the City of Mount Pearl are now redesignated as Urban Development on the regional plan map. This designation allows a full range of urban uses.

This amendment also provides the regional planning framework to accommodate the City's current Municipal Plan and Development Regulations Amendment effort, the Kenmount Hill Amendment.

# 15-04-262 <u>Proposed Amendments to the City's Noise Regulations</u> Regarding Regulation of Fireworks

Motion – Councillor Ledwell/Deputy Mayor Locke

RESOLVED THAT the following amendments to the City's Noise Regulations be adopted:

- (a) to add the definition "Fireworks means a combustible or explosive device for producing a striking display of light or a loud noise, used for signaling or as part of a celebration";
- (b) to restrict the discharge of fireworks or explosive devises on any day with the exception of New Year's Eve and Canada Day; and
- (c) on New Year's Eve and Canada Day, to restrict the discharge of fireworks or explosive devises to: between dusk on December 31 and 12:30 am on January 1, more commonly known as New Year's Eve; and between dusk and 11:00 pm on Canada Day.

<u>Discussion:</u> It was clarified that the intent of the amendment was to prohibit fireworks from being discharged within the City with the exception of specified days (New Year's Eve and Canada Day). It was acknowledged that the Noise Regulations do not regulate fireworks from a safety perspective but rather from a nuisance perspective. The Regional Fire Department addresses the safety concerns of discharging fireworks by issuing permits to vendors for the sale of consumer fireworks and requires such vendors to obtain certification on the proper use and handling of fireworks. The vendors are then responsible to review safety information with the purchaser at the time of the sale.

It was confirmed that the change in the regulations will be communicated to residents.

Councillor Stoyles questioned the enforcement of the regulations and indicated that it was pointless to put a policy in place that couldn't be enforced. It was acknowledged that the regulation may be difficult to enforce in some instances, but the City's municipal enforcement officers and other peace officers have the authority to issue a violation notice for noncompliance nevertheless.

Question called. Motion carried with Councillor Stoyles voting against the motion.

# 15-04-263 <u>Notice of Motion</u>

Amendment – Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010

Councillor Ledwell gave notice that in accordance with Section 39 of the City of Mount Pearl Act, 1988 and in accordance with Council's public notification policy, he will, at a regular meeting of Council move an amendment to the text of the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 that, if enacted, will:

- 1) In Section 2, Definitions, immediately after "Health Club Use", add ""HEALTH CONSULTATION USE" means a use that accommodates a meeting between a health or lifestyle professional and a client, but does not include a clinic."
- 2) In Section 7, Special Developments; Subsection 7.16, Home Occupation; Subsection 7.16.1, immediately after "educational use", add "health consultation use".
- 3) In Section 7, Special Developments; Subsection 7.17, Home Office; Subsection 7.17.1 (a), change "the use is restricted to one person who is a resident of the dwelling unit" to "the use is carried out by individuals who reside in the dwelling".

The purpose of this proposed amendment is to permit health consultation uses as discretionary uses in residential zones and to permit any resident of a dwelling to participate in a home office use associated with the same dwelling.
