<u>Discussion:</u> It was noted that the low bid (\$205,011.38) exceeds the project budget of \$120,000. The increase relates to the COR requirements, traffic plan requirements, quality standards and incorporation of a glass bead coating in the painting process. As a result, the scope of work will be modified to reflect a reduction in quantities and as a result, the cost will be reduced to \$142,614.00. Further consideration will be given to budget allocations to cover the increase. Council was further advised that the Engineering Committee will be considering a pilot project using thermo plastic (not paint); however, the disadvantage to this is the high cost. In the meantime, variations to the paint are being undertaken that will hopefully make the lines last a little longer. The importance of lines at higher volume intersections was noted.
