14-12-774 Proposed Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 Amendment No. 41, 2014
Group Fitness Use Amendment

Motion - Councillor Ledwell/Councillor Walsh

RESOLVED THAT the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 Amendment No. 41, 2014 be adopted and submitted to the Department of Municipal and Intergovernmental Affairs for registration.

<u>Discussion</u>: It was noted that during a review of the Development Regulations, it became evident that the definition for 'Health Club' use was not adequate to cover fitness and exercise classes that were being established throughout the City and it was determined that it would be necessary to regulate off street parking associated with group fitness and other similar uses separately from health clubs. A text amendment to the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 was proposed to define 'Group Fitness' use and establish parking standards for this use.

#### REGIONAL SERVICES & ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE

#### 14-12-777 Water Levels – Bay Bulls Big Pond

The public was advised that the most recent report shows that the water level at Bay Bulls Big Pond is increasing.

#### 14-12-778 Regional Fire Committee

The public was advised that the Regional Fire Committee met on November 24, 2014 and the 2015 budget was presented. The projected budget is \$28,868,804 with Mount Pearl's share being \$4,824,892 (\$490,320 increase).

#### 14-12-779 Regional Waste Water Committee

The public was advised that a meeting of the Regional Waste Water Committee was held on December 2, 2014 and the 2015 budget was presented. The City's cost for 2015 was anticipated to be a 3.5 to 4% increase. The projected budget is \$11,060,741 for the region and it was suggested that Mount Pearl should apply the 4% increase to prior year's rates and determine the budget by applying this rate to projected flows based on 2014 actuals.

It was also noted that Council recently supported a request from the FCM to call for a new long-term dedicated federal fund matched by local and provincial governments to assist communities with the capital cost of rebuilding their wastewater systems.

#### 14-12-780 Regional Water Committee

The public was advised that a meeting of the Regional Water Committee was held on December 2, 2014 and information on water consumption for the user municipalities was presented. Using the projected water flows, costs per cubic metre and cost to each, the 2015 budget is \$13,604,613 with Mount Pearl's share being \$4,621,849 (\$503,868 increase).

#### 14-12-781 User Fee – Regional Waste Management Facility

The public was advised that the Eastern Regional Service Board has approved its 2015 budget and fees will remain unchanged from 2014. The user fees at the Regional Waste Management Facility located at Robin Hood Bay from April 1, 2015 to March 31, 2016 will be as follows:

- Landfill-bound materials will cost \$67.60 per metric tonne
- Recyclable materials will cost \$20.00 per metric tonne

#### 14-12-782 2014 Winter Drinking Water Quality Report

The public was advised that the 2014 Winter Drinking Water Quality Report (prepared by the Department of Environment and Conservation, Water Resources Management Division) for the City's public drinking water supply was presented. It was noted that the drinking water quality index records the quality of water as "excellent" having achieved a rating of 97/100.

RESOLVED THAT the City of Mount Pearl, in accordance with The City of Mount Pearl Act, approve an annual rate of interest of 10% to be levied on all past due taxes and accounts receivable.

#### 14-12-788 Revenues and Expenditures

RESOLVED THAT the City of Mount Pearl, in accordance with The City of Mount Pearl Act, approve the 2015 Budget with operating Revenues and Expenditures totalling \$44,114,000.00.

Question called. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Discussion</u> – Members of council extended appreciation to the Corporate Services Committee and senior staff on their efforts noting that difficult decisions were made, but overall they were able to hold the line on rates and fees while maintaining a balanced budget.

Mayor Simms commented on the increased costs of regional services and suggested that member municipalities consider ways to control cost increases.

#### 14-12-789 Food Drive
