### 13-12-819 Alleged Business – Rear of Mount Pearl Square

Council was advised that the complaint regarding the placement and use of a storage container by a contractor for snow clearing purposes which resulted in noise complaints was investigated. It was noted that the container is used for salt and equipment storage by the contractor maintaining Mount Pearl Square, including snow clearing and winter maintenance. It is not used as a business base or used for other commercial properties.

Consideration is being given to relocating the containers further south on the subject property, in closer proximity to the Team Gushue Highway and away from residential properties. When a relocation site has been finalized, an application for the container (accessory building) is submitted, a development permit issued.

<u>Discussion</u> – It was noted that there will not be a significant amount of biochemical waste – an estimate of approximately 20 or 25 residential garbage carts.

> Councillor Ledwell gave notice that in accordance with Section 39 of the City of Mount Pearl Act, 1988 and in accordance with Council's public notification policy, he will, at a regular meeting of Council, move an amendment to the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010, that, if enacted, will:

In Section 11 Use Zone Schedules, Subsection 11.9 Apartment (APT) Use Zone: add the following development standards for row dwelling development:

### Row Dwelling

(a)	Minimum Lot Area	$135 m^2$ per dwelling unit
(b)	Minimum Frontage	5 m per dwelling unit
(c)	Minimum Building Line Setback	7.5 m
( <i>d</i> )	Minimum Side Yard for End Units	1.2 m
(e)	Minimum Flanking Street Side Yard Width	7.5 m
(f)	Minimum Rear Yard Depth	6 m
(g)	Maximum Lot Coverage	33%
(h)	Maximum Building Height	10 m

The purpose of this amendment is to stipulate the development standards for row dwelling development within the Apartment use zone.

# 13-12-838 <u>Notice of Motion</u> Amendment – Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010

Councillor Ledwell gave notice that in accordance with Section 39 of the City of Mount Pearl Act, 1988 and in accordance with Council's public notification policy, he will, at a regular meeting of Council, move an amendment to the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010, that, if enacted, will:

- 1. In Section 7, Special Developments, amend subsection 7.11, Family Child Care by revising conditions relating to family child care uses.
- 2. In Section 9, Off-Street Parking and Loading Regulations, revise the minimum off- street parking requirement for Family Child Care Use to provide flexibility to Council to reduce or eliminate the current standard of "One parking space for every 30 Square metres of gross floor area.
- 3. In Section 11, Use Zone Schedules, remove family child care uses from permitted to discretionary uses in a number of use zones.

The purpose of this amendment is to update the conditions relating to family child care uses and provide a process for neighbourhood commentary prior to Council's decision on these uses.

# 13-12-839 <u>Notice of Motion</u> Amendment – Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010

Councillor Ledwell gave notice that in accordance with Section 39 of the City of Mount Pearl Act, 1988 and in accordance with Council's public notification policy, he will, at a regular meeting of Council, move an amendment to the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010, that, if enacted, will:

Amend Map 1 – Land Use Zoning Map, as follows:

In the area identified as Pearlview Phase 7 (north of LaSalle Drive and west of Mount Carson Avenue), rezone approximately 2.69 hectares (6.64 cres) of land from Residential – Single Unit Detached-3 (RSU-3) to Residential High Density (RHD).

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to allow the construction of double dwellings (semi-detached dwelling units) without subsidiary apartments on lots with a minimum lot frontage of 16 m for each double dwelling.
