PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE

12-02-101 Winter Maintenance Report

Information on the City's winter control methods – such as clearing streets, ensuring culverts and drains aren't blocked, and snow removal from fire hydrants – was provided. Residents should note that the number to call after hours to report concerns or problems is 748-1006.

All City streets have been cut back to the curb and snow removal on cul de sacs continues to take place. Clearing of sidewalks is ongoing.

The proactive approach to keep culverts and drains cleared resulted in very little flooding. It was noted that assistance (i.e. sump pump, collection of damaged items) was available to anyone who did experience some flooding; however, there was no particular request for service.

12-02-107 Change Order # 1 – Glacier Arena CP3A (Geothermal Test Wells)

<u>Discussion:</u> It was noted that the scope of work is intended to winterize the well heads and provide protection from snow clearing equipment.

PLANNING AND LAND USE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

12-02-108 <u>Notice of Motion</u> Amendment – Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010

Councillor Aker gave notice that in accordance with Section 39 of the City of Mount Pearl Act, 1988 and in accordance with Council's public notification policy, he will, at a regular meeting of Council, move an amendment to the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 that, if enacted, will amend the Land Use Zoning Map as follows:

1. Rezone the properties located at 15, 17, 19, and 21 Simcoe Drive from Residential – Single Unit Detached-3 (RSU-3) to Residential – Medium Density (RMD).

The purpose of this proposed amendment is to provide Council with the authority to permit single family dwellings with or without subsidiary apartments at these properties with a minimum frontage of 15 metres.

12-02-109 Development Permit List

<u>Discussion:</u> It was noted that the permit issued for 1 Arena Road was for the first phase of the development, i.e. painting, minor upgrading.

12-02-111 <u>Rescinding of Order</u> <u>912-924 Topsail Road, Discovery Holdings</u>

Motion – Councillor Aker/Councillor Ledwell

RESOLVED THAT approval be granted to rescind the Order issued to Discovery Holdings, 912-924 Topsail Road, as all outstanding matters have now been completed or resolved to the City's satisfaction

Question called. Motion carried unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

12-02-112 Special Olympics

Councillor Ledwell extended congratulations and best wishes to the (27) athletes attending the 2012 Special Olympics Canada Winter Games taking place in St. Albert, Alberta. He noted that over half of the athletes attending were from Mount Pearl.

12-02-113 Frosty Festival

Various members of Council commented on the success of the Festival, highlighting the commitment of Chairperson Sherry Snow, as well as acknowledging the sponsors, volunteers and other committee members. Councillor Walsh was also thanked for providing musical entertainment for the seniors.

12-02-114 Provincial Youth Bowling Canada (YBC) Championships

Councillor Walsh extended congratulations and best wishes to the members of the Pearlgate YBC who will be participating in the Provincial YBC Championships taking place on the West Coast this upcoming weekend.

12-02-115 Condolences

Councillor Stoyles extended condolences to the family of the late Valda Hiscock who was a long-time resident of Mount Pearl.

12-02-116 Condolences

Councillor Stoyles extended condolences to Councillor Ledwell (and family) on the passing of his grandfather, Robert Ledwell.

12-02-117 Condolences

Councillor Aker extended condolences to Deputy Mayor Locke (and family) on the passing of his aunt, Tessie (Dunne) Murphy.

12-02-118 Fines – Mobility Impaired Parking Stalls

Councillor Aker noted that the Province is increasing the amount of the fines for illegally parking in "blue zone parking spaces". In addition to the fines for parking in designated spaces without the proper permit increasing to the new range of \$100 to \$400, the new regulations also state that signs identifying blue zone parking spaces are to be permanent and visible at all times.

Councillor Tessier referenced previous discussions on this subject noting that she had been told that an incremental increase in fines for repeat offenders was not possible.

Councillor Walsh stated that the individual to whom the permit is issued must be in the vehicle when these spaces are used. If this is not the case, it is an example of abuse and the violator should fined.

Councillor Aker requested that the Community Services Committee review the fines issued by the City to ensure they are in line with the Province's new range

and that the municipal enforcement officers are enforcing the regulations. He also questioned whether there are sufficient blue zone parking spaces in commercial properties and requested the Planning & Development staff investigate this aspect.

12-02-119 Heritage

In response to Councillor Tessier, it was noted that a process to compile the City's historical information is being put in place.

12-02-120 Municipal Enforcement Officers

Councillor Tessier welcomed the City's newest officer, noting the important role municipal enforcement carries out in the community.

12-02-121 Snowclearing

Deputy Mayor Locke advised of a request from a resident of Smallwood Drive for the operators of snowclearing equipment, particularly on Smallwood Drive, to reduce their speed in an effort to decrease the distance that the slush/ water/snow are thrown.

12-02-122 <u>28 Burrage Avenue</u>

Deputy Mayor Locke advised of concerns he's received from residents regarding 28 Burrage Avenue. Referred to Planning & Development Department.

12-02-123 Girls 4A Provincial Indoor Soccer

Deputy Mayor Locke extended congratulations to both the O'Donel and Mount Pearl Senior High soccer teams for respectively placing 1st and 2nd in the Provincial Indoor Soccer Tournament.

12-02-124 <u>Team Gushue Highway</u>

Deputy Mayor Locke responded to recent comments by Mayor Dennis O'Keefe regarding the Team Gushue Highway and amalgamation. He confirmed Mount Pearl's position that because the Team Gushue Highway is a provincial highway it should not be Mount Pearl's responsibility to pay for its maintenance. With respect to amalgamation between St. John's and Mount Pearl, he noted that Mount Pearl is a vibrant city and will continue to grow and improve services.

Mayor Simms expressed his disappointment that Mayor O'Keefe continues to talk about regional cooperation while at the same time advocate for amalgamation.

12-02-125 Frosty Festival

Mayor Simms also congratulated the Board of Directors, under the leadership of Chairperson Sherry Snow, on a successful winter carnival. He extended congratulations to incoming Chairperson Trisha Warford.
