15-02-102 <u>The Honourable Candice Bergen</u> Minister of State (Social Development)

A letter was presented from The Honourable Candice Bergen in response to the Mayor's letter regarding the City's support of the Housing Co-operative housing campaign. Minister Bergen outlined her government's support of affordable housing including reference to working with the Co-operative Housing Federation of Canada on solutions that will benefit the co-operative housing sector. She noted that housing providers with operating agreements that allow for the establishment of a Subsidy Surplus Fund can now retain any money they have in this fund and use it after their agreements with CMHC mature. It was noted that it was unlikely a housing co-operative would have any surpluses.
