### COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMITTEE REPORT

12-01-004 Winter/Spring Activity Guide

Community Events Calendar - Quotations

RESOLVED THAT the quotation for the typesetting, art work, design, printing and folding of the 2012 Winter/Spring Activity Guide and Community Events Calendar be awarded to Transcontinental respectively in the amounts of \$7,967.00 and \$5,296.00.

### 12-01-005 Running Event - January 22, 2012

12-01-008 <u>Award of Quotation - Demolition of Dwelling – 107 Smallwood Drive</u>

Motion – Councillor Ledwell/Councillor Stoyles

RESOLVED THAT the quotation for the demolition of the dwelling located at 107 Smallwood Drive be awarded to Tony Farrell's Excavating based in the amount of \$10,000 plus HST.

<u>Discussion</u>: Council questioned if consideration had been given to relocating the house (rather than demolishing). It was noted that there would be an additional cost if the house were to be moved (i.e. removal of foundation, disconnecting utilities, site cleanup).

### 12-01-009 J & T Construction – Variance Request

<u>Proposed Reduction to the Minimum Building Line Setback</u> 58 Glencoe Drive Extension to the Main Building on the Property

Motion - Councillor Aker/Councillor Ledwell

RESOLVED THAT a variance request to accommodate a building extension on the east side of the existing structure for 58 Glencoe Drive, that will reduce the minimum building line setback to 13.85 metres, be approved and a development permit issued subject to the following conditions:

- 2. Recommendations of the Finance Division
- 3. Recommendations of the Engineering Services Division
- 4. Recommendations of Newfoundland Power
- 5. Recommendations of the St. John's Regional Fire Department
- 6. Landscaping plan & securities required in association with this development permit

## 12-01-010 Conveyance – Property to the Rear of 84 Smallwood Drive

RESOLVED THAT approval be granted for the Mayor and CAO to sign a conveyance agreement representing the sale of a narrow strip of property at the rear of 82-92 Smallwood Drive.

<u>Discussion:</u> The City has agreed to sell the property to the owner of 84 Smallwood Drive for the cost of the land survey and associated legal and registration fees. The costs of the land survey are \$1,073.50 and legal fees \$463.87 for a total of \$1,537.37. The registration, which is to be paid separately, is \$105.66.

## 12-01-020 Snowclearing Regulations

Councillor Tessier reminded residents that in accordance with the Snowclearing Regulations, snow cannot be shovelled, plowed or blown from a driveway or parking lot onto City streets and sidewalks.

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### 12-01-021 Condolences

Councillor Stoyles extended sympathy to the family and friends of the late Brendan Kelly, a long-time resident. It was requested that a message of condolence be forwarded to Mr. Kelly's family.

## 12-01-022 St. John's Amalgamation Report

Councillor Walsh commented on the amalgamation report released by the City of St. John's. He stated that the report showed only marginal support for amalgamation and highlighted the need for regional cooperation. He noted that he is a member of various regional services committees and the St. John's officials are fair and cooperative. Councillor Walsh reiterated the importance of meaningful regional cooperation rather than amalgamation and hopes that Mayor O'Keefe (St. John's) is sincere about working with other municipalities.

## 12-01-023 <u>Snowclearing Regulations</u>

Councillor Ledwell reminded residents that in accordance with the Snowclearing Regulations, vehicles are not permitted to be parked on City streets between the hours of 1:00 AM and 8:00 AM. It was also noted that vehicles are not permitted to be parked on any street during a storm and for 12 hours thereafter.

### 12-01-024 Frosty Festival

Councillor Ledwell encouraged residents to participate in the upcoming Frosty Festival. He noted that it's the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary and many activities are planned.

### 12-01-025 Condolences

Deputy Mayor Locke extended sympathy to the family and friends of the late Keith Clancey. It was requested that a message of condolence be forwarded to Mr. Clancey's family.

### 12-01-026 Mount Pearl Minor Hockey Association – Novice Hockey Player
