10-01-035 <u>Swimming Pool</u>

Council was advised that the swimming pool is now open following repairs to correct leaks and heating issues. Appreciation was extended to the general public and user groups for their patience during this unscheduled closure of the facility.

CORRESPONDENCE

10-01-036 <u>The Honourable Peter MacKay</u> Minister of National Defence

A letter was presented from The Honourable Peter MacKay in response to the City's letter regarding the provision of search and rescue (SAR) capability on the Avalon Peninsula. The Minister advised that all factors have been considered, and as a result, there are no discernable deficiencies in the region that warrant an increase in the ability to deliver Canadian Forces SAR response by basing additional SAR helicopters in the St. John's area.

10-01-037 <u>Honourable Charlene Johnson</u> Minister of Environment & Conservation

A letter was presented from the Honourable Charlene Johnson in response to the City's letter regarding moose vehicle collisions. The Minister advised that the Province is taking action in managing the risks associated with vehicular traffic coming in contact with moose, i.e. using moose quotas as a tool to manage excessive densities, increase driver awareness, and roadside brush clearing. It was requested that a copy of the Minister's letter be forwarded to Eugene Nippard, Chairperson of the Save Our People Action Committee.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE

10-01-038 <u>Traffic Regulations – Fine Increase</u> Re – Designated Mobility Impaired Space

Motion - Councillor Walsh/Councillor Lane

RESOLVED THAT the Traffic Regulations be amended as follows:

- 1. A person other than the holder of a permit or a person accompanying the holder of a permit shall:
 - a. Not park a motor vehicle in a designated mobility impaired parking space.
 - b. A permit shall be displayed in the windshield of a vehicle occupying a designated mobility impaired parking space.
 - c. A person shall not park within two meters of a sidewalk access ramp whether on private or public property.
- 2. A person who contravenes a provision of these regulations is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to:
 - a. A fine of \$100.00

and

b. In default of payment of a fine, imprisonment for not less than 2 days and not more than 10 days.

<u>Discussion:</u> It was noted that this amendment increases the fine from \$52.00 to \$100.00. It was also indicated that the municipal enforcement division, in consultation with the business community, will undertake an increased patrol for these infractions. Clarification was provided whereby it was confirmed that an unauthorized person using this type of permit can be fined. It was also noted that the City cannot increase subsequent fines as there is no provision in the Provincial Government Regulations and therefore the City cannot supersede a higher governing authority.

RESOLVED THAT approval be granted to engage Abitibi Geophysics to undertake magnetic subsurface and ground penetrating surveys in the

reclaimed area of Pearlgate Centre recreational area, at a cost of \$47,292.00, (plus HST and standby charges).

<u>Discussion:</u> It was noted that this undertaking is a part of Council's ongoing plans to enhance this site for future development. It was clarified that standby charges would result from unforeseen stoppage in work not caused by their own operation. The consultant has indicated that the work may actually be accomplished for an amount less than the quotation.

RESOLVED THAT change order # 3 for the Glacier Arena Complex Expansion (foundations and building envelope) be approved in the amount of \$144,707.39 (HST included).

<u>Discussion:</u> Council was advised that most of this amount relates to previously planned and approved contracts with some costs being covered by the approved contingency for this project. The consultant has been requested to provide a revised budget for the Pearlgate Recreation Multiplex and Glacier Arena Complex to reflect the approved budgets and contingency for both projects.

<u>Discussion:</u> Council noted that the application was refused on the basis of the transient use and the potential disruption it could cause in a residential neighborhood.

10-01-059 <u>Mount Pearl Development Regulations Amendment No. 197, 2009</u> (Election Signs Locations Amendment)

RESOLVED THAT approval be granted to adopt the Mount Pearl Development Regulations Amendment No. 197, 2009 (Election Signs Locations Amendment).

<u>Discussion:</u> This amendment provides Council with more direct control over the placement of election signs on an election day, as well as in relation to medians, boulevards and intersection islands situated within the street rights of way.

Council questioned whether the City's MHA's had been notified of the proposed change. It was noted that the usual notification process was followed.

Councillor Stoyles indicated her opposition to the motion as she felt that previous changes to the regulations were sufficient. She felt that candidates needed as much exposure as possible when running for office and that to reduce the available sites for signs would be to their disadvantage. She concurred with disallowing signs at sites that would cause safety concerns.

Other councillors indicated their support of the amendment noting that changes were being made at this time as a result of issues raised during the election, there were still sufficient public property locations remaining for the placement of signs in addition to private property (subject to property owner's approval) and as a compromise to reduce visual clutter.

Question called. Motion carried with Councillor Stoyles voting against the motion.

NEW BUSINESS

10-01-060 <u>Firefighters Arbitration Award</u>

Councillor Lane asked about the financial implications for Mount Pearl following the recent decision made by the Arbitration Board for the collective agreement for regional firefighters. It was noted that while there were some funds reserved, the complete financial implications will be determined shortly.

10-01-061 Webcasting

It was confirmed that public council meetings will be webcast from this point forward and available to viewers via the City's website.

10-01-062 Fisheries Minister Gail Shea

Councillor Lane voiced his concerns regarding the recent incident involving Minister Shea and a PETA member. He noted that such actions are

unacceptable and hoped that the incident would be treated seriously by the justice system.

10-01-063 RBC Local Hockey Leader – Gary Martin

Deputy Mayor Locke advised that during a recent ceremony, Minor Hockey Association raised a banner at the Glacier in recognition of Gary Martin as a recipient of the RBC Local Hockey Leader award. Mr. Martin's contributions to the community were acknowledged with appreciation.

10-01-064 <u>Land Force Atlantic Area (LFAA) – Change of Command</u>

Councillor Stoyles extended congratulations to Brigadier-General Anthony Stack upon his recent appointment as LFAA Commander. She noted that Mr. Stack is currently on a leave of absence from his duties as the Principal of St. Peter's Junior High School. It was requested that a letter of congratulations be forwarded to Mr. Stack from the Mayor's office.

10-01-065 Donations

Councillor Stoyles extended appreciation to residents of the province for so generously supporting charitable organizations.

10-01-066 Mount Pearl Minor Hockey Association (MPMHA)

Councillor Walsh advised that he was unaware of the recent event held for Gary Martin and would have liked to attend. He noted that it was unfortunate that MPMHA didn't notify all councillors about the event.

10-01-067 <u>Frosty Festival</u>

Councillor Walsh encouraged residents and visitors to attend the Frosty Festival taking place from February $5^{th} - 13^{th}$. He commented on the opening night, noting that a very entertaining show was planned. He extended appreciation to the Committee for organizing a wide variety of events.

10-01-068 Swimming Pool

Councillor Walsh commented on the importance of the new multi-plex given the recent problems at the pool. Appreciation was extended to the public for their patience and to staff for a job well done.
