# 15-06-378 Proposed Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 Amendment No 46, 2015 34 Glencoe Drive Amendment

This item is related to a request from Inmarsat Solutions Canada Inc. to purchase City-owned land to the rear of the company's offices located at 34 Glencoe Drive. The company wishes to consolidate all its offices in the region at that location and is, therefore, looking at expanding the existing building and the accompanying parking lot. The land is necessary to provide enough space for the proposed parking lot expansion. The area of the land being considered is 2,947 m² (31,725 ft²) in area.

In order to accommodate this request, an amendment is required to rezone the subject property from Open Space (OS) to Industrial - Light (IL).

It was noted that the subject property will not negatively impact the natural gateway into the business park, will not affect the nearby watercourse and will result in an economic benefit to the City.

RESOLVED THAT the proposed Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 Amendment No. 46, 2015 (rezoning 2,947 m² (31,725 ft²) land to the rear of 34 Glencoe Drive from Open Space (OS) to Industrial - Light (IL)) be adopted and documentation submitted to the Department of Municipal and Intergovernmental Affairs for registration.

# 15-06-379 <u>Atlantic Chamber of Commerce Inc.</u> Incoming President

For the information of the public, Ms. Deborah Feltham of Mount Pearl is the incoming President of the Atlantic Chamber of Commerce Inc. A letter of congratulations will be forwarded from the Mayor's office.

## 15-06-380 <u>Canada Post Community Mailboxes</u> <u>Status Report</u>

For the information of the public, Canada Post has now finalized and provided its list of locations for community mailboxes in Mount Pearl and installations should commence shortly.

Councillor Stoyles raised concerns regarding the community mailboxes and issues residents have had with the existing structures, i.e. snowclearing, frozen

locks, and difficulty in reaching Canada Post officials. She does not support the initiative and indicated she would like to see the previously referenced list of locations.

It was acknowledged that while Council would prefer the continuation of door-todoor delivery, the matter is of federal authority and Canada Post is moving forward with the transition. It was also indicated that the community mailbox format, while not perfect, has functioned well for residents for a number of years.

# 15-06-381 <u>Helicopter Simulator and Training Technology</u> Canadian Aviation Electronics Ltd. (CAE) Facility in Beclin Business Park

For the information of the public, CAE has opened a brand new world-class helicopter simulator in the Beclin Business Park. The specialized training center will develop local expertise in a very technical business and will create jobs and help train pilots locally. A letter of congratulations will be forwarded from the Mayor's office.

### 15-06-382 Notice of Motion

Councillor Ledwell advised that in accordance with Section 39 of the City of Mount Pearl Act, 1988, and, in accordance with Council's public notification policy, he will, at a regular meeting of Council, move an amendment to the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 that, if enacted, will:

- 1. Amend the text of the Mount Pearl Development Regulations as follows:
  - a) In Section 11, USE ZONE SCHEDULES, within Section 11.6 Residential High Density (RHD):
    - in section 11.6.3 Development Standards, under Double Dwellings, in subsection (a) Minimum Lot Area, replace the standard of "275 m<sup>2</sup> dwelling unit" with the standard "270 m<sup>2</sup> per dwelling unit".

The purpose of this proposed amendment is to correct the minimum lot area for a double dwelling that corresponds with a minimum lot frontage of 9 m by a lot depth of 30 m per dwelling unit.

### 15-06-385 Regional Water Services Committee

The most recent report shows that the water level for Bay Bulls Big Pond is dropping.

Residents were reminded of the City's Water Conservation Program (further details are available on the City's website).

Information was presented on the leak detection equipment, noting that 25 water leaks have been identified this year, which is a combination of main lines and private services. Eight have been repaired thus far. The water wasted annually from these 25 leaks is about 400 million litres. The IPW Director provided further details on the successful use of the new equipment.

### 15-06-386 Community Garden

The public information session, held on May 27, regarding community gardens was well attended. Presentations were made by City staff and the Food Security Network and feedback was gathered for further consideration by Council. This year's Green Team will provide assistance in the establishment of the garden.

### TRANSPORTATION & PUBLIC SAFETY

# 15-06-387 Note to Motorists

Caution City Parks & Facilities

A reminder to motorists; children are out of school and will be using streets and parks, please be mindful of the exits surrounding the city parks and facilities.

#### 15-06-388 Park Patrol

Park Patrol is in place and will be monitoring the trails, parks and facilities throughout the summer months. If residents witness any incidents or have any concerns, please contact the City at 748-1000.

## 15-06-389 <u>Old Placentia Road Closures</u> During Play ON – June 11-14

Appreciation was extended to the residents and business owners for their patience with the road closures this past weekend, June 11 - 14, due to the Play On 4-on-4 Hockey.

<u>Discussion:</u> Councillor Stoyles raised concerns with the event, noting the complaints she received from the community (businesses, churches and residents). She indicated that while she supported the event, she did not support its location.

Other members of Council also commented on the event, noting the positive feedback from residents, participants and neighbouring businesses. It was acknowledged that while the traffic detour may have been inconvenient; at no time was there a danger to the public.

It was noted that the Community Services Committee will be reviewing the event, consider the issues raised, and provide a subsequent report to Council.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

## 15-06-390 Traffic Lights – Lindbergh/Ruth/Michener

Deputy Mayor Locke raised concerns regarding the above noted intersection, in particular, the simultaneous green traffic light and pedestrian walk signals. He noted that motorists do not always yield to the pedestrian and suggested consideration be given to an "all red" signalization when the walk signal is activated. It was requested that the Transportation & Safety Committee review the issue.

### 15-06-391 <u>Congratulations – Reg White</u>

Members of council extended congratulations to Reg White on being chosen a National Volunteer of the Year for Habitat for Humanity.

Mayor Simms noted that the City is pursuing the possibility of providing land for a Habitat for Humanity house.

#### 15-06-392 Feedback from FCM Conference

Deputy Mayor Locke provided some information on subjects he learned about at the FCM Conference; one being the use of recycled rubber for sidewalks (referred to Infrastructure & Public Works) and the other related to a tree planting program (referred to Planning & Development). It was noted that it was possible to determine the City's tree canopy using GIS. He suggested that consideration be given to implementing a similar program.

Councillor Stoyles advised of a new product for ice control. Information will be forwarded to Infrastructure & Public Works.

## 15-06-393 <u>Helen Hodder – Kinette Club</u>

Councillor Stoyles extended congratulations to Helen Hodder who won the Carmel Prior Public Speaking Award which will see her proceed to the National Convention in Manitoba. It was requested that a letter of congratulations be forwarded to Ms. Hodder from the Mayor's office.
