13-03-198 Earth Hour – 2013

March 23, 2013, 8:30 – 9:30 p.m. Newfoundland Time

Information was presented on Earth Hour, a one-hour period when the world will turn off its lights to show it is possible to take action on climate change. Switching off your lights is one simple action that you can take to help make a difference and to send a message that we care about our planet. 13-03-199 Notice of Motion

<u>Amendment – Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010</u>

Councillor Aker gave notice that in accordance with Section 39 of the City of Mount Pearl Act, 1988 and in accordance with Council's public notification policy, he will, at a regular meeting of Council, move an amendment to the text of the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 that, if enacted, will amend the IL Use Zones Table as follows:

In Section 11.19.5 – 'Landscaped Front Yard',

The front yard shall be a minimum of ten metres (10 m) from the street line, to be used for nothing other than landscaping, outdoor display court, permitted access, driveways and identification sign.

delete the word "identification" and replace with the word "permitted", the section then to read:

The front yard shall be a minimum of ten metres (10 m) from the street line, to be used for nothing other than landscaping, outdoor display court, permitted access, driveways and permitted sign.

The purpose of this amendment is to provide Council with the authority to permit identification, freestanding and billboard signs in the landscaped front yards within the IL Use Zones.

13-03-200 Development Permits

NEW BUSINESS

13-03-202 Damaged Property

Deputy Mayor Locke commented on City property, i.e. benches and garbage receptacles, that's been damaged due to snow clearing activities. It was requested that consideration be given to relocating/removing the items prior to the winter season. (Referred to Public Works Committee)

13-03-203 <u>Mount Pearl Marlins – Swim for Hope Fundraiser</u>

Deputy Mayor Locke, along with other members of Council, extended congratulations to the Marlins Swim Club on a successful fundraiser in support of the Dr. H. Bliss Murphy Cancer Care Foundation and the swim clubs that are members of Swimming NL.

Councillor Aker extended appreciation to Youth Ambassador Adam Keating for his assistance with the "boat building" component of the Swim for Hope.

13-03-204 Pedestrian Activated Traffic Light – Topsail Rd (Mary Queen of the World School)

Councillor Tessier commented on reports of drivers proceeding through the red light when the above noted traffic light has been activated by a pedestrian. She highlighted the obvious dangers of this situation and reminded drivers to be more responsible and drive with care and caution. She noted that the traffic calmer and speed monitor sign will be put in use when weather conditions improve.

13-03-205 Citizen of the Year

Councillor Aker advised that the Citizen of the Year Banquet will be held on April 20 and he, along with Councillor Stoyles, encouraged nomination submissions from the various groups as well as residents.

13-03-206 Environmental Assessment Bulletin

Councillor Aker commented on the Environmental Assessment Bulletin released by the Department of Environment & Conservation regarding a proposal to operate a facility for the decontamination and temporary storage of tubular containing Naturally Occurring Radioactive Material (NORM) at Atlantic Inspection Services Inc., at 138 Clyde Avenue. It was noted that the company has not submitted a development application to the City.

The deadline for public comment to the Department of Environment & Conservation is April 17, 2013. In accordance with the City's procedures, the referenced notice will be circulated to City Directors for commentary as well as the

registered property and business owners within a minimum distance of 150 m of the proposed location. The letter shall request that a copy of any written responses to the Department be forwarded to the City.

Reference was made to a similar application made to Council in 2002 that was subsequently refused.

13-03-207 Lieutenant Governor

Councillor Stoyles extended congratulations to the new Lieutenant Governor, Frank Fagan, and wished him well during his term of office.

13-03-208 Church of the Good Shepherd

Councillor Stoyles advised that the Church of the Good Shepherd resumed its weekly community lunch (free of charge) on Wednesday, March 6, 12:00 noon. She noted the success of the program.

13-03-209 Snow Clearing Regulations – On Street Parking

Councillor Stoyles noted that the "on street" parking ban will be lifted as of midnight on March 31; however, no vehicle is permitted to be parked on any street during a storm and for 12 hours thereafter.

13-03-210 Northeast Avalon Joint Council (NEAJC)

Councillor Stoyles advised that the monthly NEAJC meeting is scheduled for March 20 in the Town of Conception Bay South. In addition, the group will be holding a strategic planning session on March 23 from 9:00 – 12:00 in the Mount Pearl City Hall.

13-03-211 "Best Wishes"

Councillor Stoyles extended best wishes to Deputy Mayor Shannie Duff (City of St. John's) in recognition of her upcoming surgery.

13-03-212 <u>Congratulations</u>

Councillor Stoyles extended congratulations to Gerard Lewis and Michele Peach on receiving the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal.

13-03-213 <u>Mount Pearl-Paradise Chamber of Commerce</u> <u>Mayor of Paradise – Outlook Lunch</u>

Councillor Walsh commented on the Chamber's "Outlook Lunch" held today's date in the Town of Paradise by Mayor Ralph Wiseman. He extended

congratulations to Mayor Wiseman and noted the continued growth and prosperity of the community.

13-03-214 Snowclearing Regulations – Throwing Snow onto City Streets/Sidewalks

Councillor Walsh reminded residents that it is against regulations to throw snow from lawns onto City streets/sidewalks. It is counterproductive to the City's efforts as well as inconsiderate of neighbouring property owners.

13-03-215 NORM Application

Councillor Walsh commented on the previously referenced NORM application noting his opposition to the application that was submitted in 2002 and unless there was information that has changed since that time, he would not be supporting the most recent proposal. He noted that Council has made a conscious decision to moving Donovans from an industrial park to a business park.

13-03-216 <u>Mount Pearl Skating Club – Ice Show</u>

Councillor Ledwell advised that the annual Ice Show will be held on Sunday, March 24, at the Glacier.

13-03-217 Mount Pearl – Paradise Chamber of Commerce – Outlook Lunch

Mayor Simms commented on the expansion of the Chamber of Commerce to include the Town of Paradise by working together on issues of common need. Congratulations were extended to Mayor Wiseman on his informative "outlook" presentation.

13-03-218 Municipalities NL – Avalon Regional Meeting

Mayor Simms spoke of the recently held MNL Avalon Regional Meeting, noting the topics discussed were informative and made particular reference to the establishment of the Municipal Safety Council.
