PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE

12-03-134 Household Hazardous Waste Day

12-03-135 Winter Maintenance Update

Information was presented on winter activities such as salt usage, snowclearing efforts, repairs and maintenance. Salt usage for February is reduced significantly due to the nature of February's winter events along with the addition of two new flyers. This equipment provides a more accurate distribution system which allows operators to achieve a better spread pattern of salt while reducing the spread rate. Residents were also reminded not to park vehicles on the street overnight, during a snow storm, and to be cognizant of snowclearing efforts following a storm.

12-03-146 Preventative Maintenance Services – Lift Stations

Motion – Councillor Ledwell/Councillor Stoyles

RESOLVED THAT approval be granted to renew the preventative maintenance agreement with Xylem for the City's (7) lift stations for the quoted amount of \$1,609.65 per inspection, plus HST.

12-03-147 Pearlgate Multiplex - Update

The tender call has been issued for the Multiplex CP3 project. It is anticipated that the construction schedule from date of contract award will be approximately 26 months.

This third contract of the project will incorporate an upgraded youth centre, fitness area, a walking track and a swimming pool. This will be an energy efficient facility using advanced technologies already in place with the first two phases of the Pearlgate Recreation Multiplex/Glacier Arena.

12-03-148 Softball Building - Update

Construction of the Team Gushue softball building is ongoing and is anticipated to be completed by the end of June, 2012 to accommodate softball leagues for the 2012 season.

12-03-150 ESRI Canada Calendar

Council was advised that the ESRI Canada calendar is now available and features, for December month, mapping of the City of Mount Pearl as prepared by the City's Cartographic Technician.

12-03-151 <u>Application for Subdivision and Double Dwelling – DA12-0025</u> <u>16 Sunrise Avenue</u>

<u>Motion</u> – Councillor Aker/Councillor Ledwell

RESOLVED THAT the application by the property owner, proposing to demolish portion of the existing dwelling and construct an addition, subdivide the parcel to create two (2) lots, and create a Double Dwelling at 16 Sunrise Avenue, be approved and that a development permit be issued subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Inspection Services conditions;
- 2. Engineering Services conditions;
- 3. Finance Division conditions;
- 4. Newfoundland Power conditions; and,
- 5. Planning Division's conditions.

<u>Discussion</u>: It was noted that this development replaced a previous proposal that had not been supported by neighbouring property owners, and ultimately, not by Council. This application meets all regulations and as a result, a briefing session was not necessary. However, correspondence has been forwarded to the residents who had attended the briefing session advising of the revised proposal.

Councillor Aker gave notice that in accordance with Section 39 of the City of Mount Pearl Act, 1988 and in accordance with Council's public notification policy, he will, at a regular meeting of Council, move an amendment to the text of the Mount Pearl Noise Regulations that, if enacted, will update numerous sections of the regulations to reflect current approaches to the regulating of sound and noise in an urban environment.

12-03-154 <u>Notice of Motion</u> Amendment – Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010

Councillor Aker gave notice that in accordance with Section 39 of the City of Mount Pearl Act, 1988 and in accordance with Council's public notification policy, he will, at a regular meeting of Council, move an amendment to the text of the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 that, if enacted, will:

1. In Section 6 – General Development Standards add a section titled "Heat Pumps" immediately after section 6.15 which provides for the location and separation distances of heat pumps from dwellings.

The purpose of this amendment is to specify the location of heat pumps on properties in relation to dwellings on adjacent lots.

RESOLVED THAT approval be granted under the authority of Section 16 of the *Urban and Rural Planning Act* 2000 to adopt the City of Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010, Amendment No. 2, 2012.

<u>Discussion</u>: The purpose of the proposed amendment is to rezone the properties at 15, 17, 19 and 21 Simcoe Drive to provide Council with the authority to permit single family dwellings with or without subsidiary apartments at these properties with a minimum frontage of 15 metres.

- 3. City Inspector's conditions;

- 5. The development meeting Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010.

Councillor Aker commented on an interview with Councillor Hann (St. John's) and Councillor Walsh that promoted regional cooperation between both municipalities.

Councillor Tessier reminded residents to be aware that garbage may need to be covered to prevent being torn open even though it is not required to be covered until April 1.

12-03-163 Special Olympics

12-03-164 <u>Councillor Ledwell – Award</u>

Councillor Tessier extended congratulations to Councillor Ledwell on being recognized by his employer, Canada Revenue Agency, for his excellence in community services.

12-03-165 Line Painting

Deputy Mayor Locke questioned if there was an interim measure that could be taken to address the lack of street markings (lines) on City streets, in particular, the Donovans Business Park. Issue referred to Infrastructure & Public Works Committee for consideration.

12-03-166 Salt

Deputy Mayor Locke requested consideration be given to salting sidewalks in school zones. Issue referred to Infrastructure & Public Works Committee for consideration.

12-03-167 <u>Condolences</u>

Councillor Stoyles extended condolences to the families and friends of the late Frank Mercer, Winston Rose, and Anita Kelland.

12-03-168 Mount Pearl H.J. Bartlett Electric Senior Blades

Councillor Stoyles extended congratulations to the Senior Blades on their season. Appreciation was extended to their sponsor, Harry Bartlett.

12-03-169 <u>807 Kinsmen Cadets</u>

Councillor Stoyles advised that the 807 Kinsmen Cadets will be holding a card game on Sunday, March 11, at Park Place from 3:00 – 6:00 pm.

12-03-170 <u>Meeting – MNL</u>

Councillor Stoyles advised that MNL will be hosting a meeting of its membership on Monday, March 12, at 10:30 am, Capital Hotel. The purpose of this meeting will be to provide an update on MNL's discussion with the Provincial Government on the fiscal framework; to collectively voice displeasure at the government's continued inaction; and to rally support for the demand of municipal governments for immediate fiscal assistance.

12-03-171 <u>Heat Pumps</u>

Councillor Walsh advised of problems a resident is experiencing as a result of a neighbouring property's heat pump. He noted that there are regulations in other jurisdictions to govern their use and presented this information. It was noted that the previously presented Notion of Motion will address this problem.

12-03-172 Best Boy Productions

Councillor Walsh extended congratulations to Best Boy Productions, commenting on the recent Telegram article that highlighted their business.

12-03-173 <u>Citizen of the Year</u>

Councillor Ledwell advised that the Citizen of the Year function will be held on April 14 and nomination packages have been forwarded to the community groups. He encouraged residents to consider nominating a volunteer.

12-03-174 Urban Municipalities Committee (UMC)

Mayor Simms provided an update on topics discussed by the UMC at their recent meetings. He referenced a study commissioned by the MMSB regarding indiscriminate dumping. The UMC is seeking suggestions on ways to address the problem.

The UMC also discussed whether there was really any serious consideration on the part of the Province to provide a new fiscal arrangement for municipalities. He referenced the Premier's statement of improving municipal operating grants, noting that this was not what MNL was seeking. He encouraged members of council to attend the MNL meeting scheduled for March 12.
