PLANNING AND LAND USE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

12-05-300 Proposed Consolidation of Property, Building Extension & Site Improvements

Gun Range and Automotive Sales Use – Coastal Marine

1246 -1258 Topsail Road, 1260 Topsail Road, and 5 Cory King Drive

Motion - Councillor Aker/Councillor Ledwell

RESOLVED THAT an application to consolidate 5 Corey King Drive, 1246-1258 Topsail Road and 1260 Topsail Road to accommodate an expansion to the existing building at 1246-1258 Topsail Road, site work, and a Change of Use (Addition of General Assembly Use - Indoor Shooting Range) be approved and a development permit issued subject to the following conditions (details provided in Committee report dated April 26, 2012):

- 1. RCMP conditions;
- 2. Department of Environment and Conservation Pollution Prevention Division's conditions;
- 3. Newfoundland Power's conditions;

- 4. St. John's Regional Fire Department's conditions;
- 5. Engineering Services Division's conditions;
- 6. Inspection Services Division's conditions;
- 7. Finance Division's conditions;
- 8. Planning and Development Department's conditions; and,
- 9. The Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010

<u>Discussion:</u> It was clarified that there are regulations in place to prevent an untrained person from using the facility – which is an independent business (Coastal Marine) from the Rod & Gun Club.

Discussion ensued on the type of zoning (mixed commercial – general assembly) for the operation, noting that it fit well from a land use perspective in this location. In the event there are future applications for a similar use, the intent now is to prepare an amendment that will put in place regulations, conditions and requirements as to where this type of operation would be permitted. It was suggested that this may require consideration as a separate zone use so that the implication can't be that the use can be located in just any mixed development area.

Question called. Motion carried unanimously.

12-05-301 <u>Proposed Mount Pearl Municipal Plan Amendment</u> Section 7.6.1 Road Hierarchy – Mount Carson Avenue

RESOLVED THAT the Mount Pearl Municipal Plan 2010 be amended by denoting the reference to "Grangel Road / Wyatt Boulevard" to section 7.6.1, Arterial Roads.

<u>Discussion:</u> Council was advised that the Regional Fire Services will be notified that the City would like to retain Grangel Road as a name for a Mount Pearl street. The process for notifying the local authorities when mapping changes are made, i.e. street names, civic numbering, etc., was outlined. It was requested that staff investigate how maps for GPS and Google systems are updated.

<u>Amendment – Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010</u>

Councillor Aker gave notice that in accordance with Section 39 of the City of Mount Pearl Act, 1988 and in accordance with Council's public notification policy, he will, at a regular meeting of Council, move an amendment to the text of the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 that, if enacted, will:

Amend Map 1 - Land Use Zoning Map, as follows:

1. Rezone the property at 166 Park Avenue from *Community and Public Services* (PB) to *Apartment* (APT).

The intention of this proposed amendment is to provide Council with the authority to consider apartment building proposals at this property.

12-05-305 <u>Team Gushue Complex</u>

Property Acquisition

RESOLVED THAT direction be given to the City's solicitor to proceed with the expropriation process on the basis of the appraised value of the property at the rear of the Smallwood Arena required for the Team Gushue Complex site improvements.

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE

12-05-306 Update

The public was provided an update on ongoing activities by the Public Works Department, i.e. pothole, curb and lawn damage repairs, street and sidewalk cleaning, as well as clean up of playgrounds and parks. It was noted that the obligation is on the homeowner to report damaged property.

Residents were encouraged to be mindful of waste and not contribute to the accumulation of litter, especially noticeable along the main streets near businesses. Business owners were encouraged to be diligent in their efforts to clean up around their properties.

12-05-307 National Day of Mourning

Councillor Aker advised that he participated in the National Day of Mourning wreath laying ceremony held on April 28 at Confederation Building. The event is held in honour of workers killed or injured on the job, or suffering from industrial illness. He commended the St. John's and District Labour Council and Federation of Labour on a well organized event.

12-05-308 Construction

Councillor Tessier commented on the ongoing and planned construction zones and encouraged drivers to be patient and/or find alternate routes. She also noted that contractors have a responsibility to ensure their employees comply with safety rules.

12-05-309 <u>Increased Pedestrian Traffic</u>

Councillor Tessier also encouraged drivers to be cognizant of an increased number of children/pedestrians now that the weather has improved.
