INFRASTRUCTURE AND PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE

15-05-328 Summit Centre (Aquatic Change Rooms) – Proposal

RESOLVED THAT approval be granted to engage SNC-Lavalin, at a cost of \$10,740.00 (+ HST) to undertake the following scope of work to address the ponding of water in the Summit Centre change rooms:

- Three-hour visual inspection of the drains/ponding water in change rooms to be completed by architectural, mechanical and project manager
- Completion of infrared/thermal testing at an estimated fee of \$3,000
- Provide brief report indicating the findings of the inspection to determine the viability of the floor drains or if another, more feasible, option can be explored
- Order of magnitude cost estimate of any recommendations

15-05-329 <u>Building Canada Fund (BCF) Project</u> Street Improvements for Pumphrey Avenue and Princeton Crescent

RESOLVED THAT approval be granted to transfer funds from the Multi-Year Capital Works 2012-2014 program to the Building Canada Fund project in the amount of \$278,114.18 to accommodate the required budget.

15-05-330 <u>Contract Award – Street Improvements - Building Canada Fund</u> Pumphrey Avenue and Princeton Crescent

RESOLVED THAT approval be granted to award the contract for street improvements for Pumphrey Avenue and Princeton Crescent to the lowest qualified bidder, Dexter Construction Company Ltd., for the bid amount of \$1,406,068.04 (HST included) which is accommodated within the existing allocated budget for the project.

- Street Markings (Line Painting) work is ongoing and dependent on weather conditions:
- Asphalt and Concrete Works work is ongoing and will continue through to June;
- 2015 Street Upgrading work is ongoing (Third Street, Wilcox Place, Second Street, Winsor Place, Hann Place, Hounsell Avenue, Jeffers Place, O'Keefe Avenue)
- Spring Maintenance Operations work is ongoing; seasonal crews are back May 19;
- Water and Sewer work is ongoing, staff has received training for safe use
 of correlator. It was noted that the correlator was used during the training
 and the time associated with finding the leak was significantly reduced which
 will result in cost savings.

The two main roles for the Green Team will be to assist the City with the establishment of a community garden and to develop a variety of educational materials for schools relating to the City's 'Anti-Litter' Campaign, similarly to the materials developed for "Safey the Snowplough". The Team will start their orientation session at the end of June, and expected to start with the City on Monday, July 6. They will be working with the City until August 21, 2015. Appreciation was extended to the Conservation Corps of Newfoundland & Labrador for their partnership.
