10-05-327 Vehicle Side Guard Protection

The public was advised that all new City vehicles (heavy equipment) will be outfitted with side guards.

The efforts of Jeannette Holman-Price for this under guard protection were recognized. Council also noted their support of Ms. Holman-Price through the provision of financial assistance in her pursuit for changes to no-fault insurance laws and improving the safety of all trucks throughout Canada. Reference was also made to M.P. Siobhan Coady's introduction of a private member's bill to increase road safety. This Bill would amend the Motor Vehicle Safety Act to ensure all vehicles in the higher weight categories would be equipped with side guard protection.

Steel Fabrication, Sandblasting & Spray Painting (Discretionary Use) 158 Glencoe Drive

RESOLVED THAT approval be granted to issue a conditional development permit to Talon Energy Services (formerly known as Acquaint Contracting Services) to carry out an interior fit-up of the complete expanse of the existing 1,115 m² building at 158 Glencoe Drive (Skyway Holdings) to accommodate a facility that prepares heavy steel for construction, including spray painting and sand blasting, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Department of Environment and Conservation recommendations.
- 2. St. John's Regional Fire Department requirements.
- 3. Government Service Centre approvals prior to any building permits being issued.
- 4. The development meeting the City of Mount Pearl Development Regulations, 1988.
- 5. The development meeting the City's Inspection Services, Finance Division and Planning and Development requirements.

10-05-335 Request for Increase in Fence Height 1 Forsey Place

RESOLVED THAT a request from the property owner of 1 Forsey Place to extend the height of the fence to 2.2 metres be denied AND FURTHER THAT the property owner be advised that the maximum fence height permitted is 1.8 metres as per the City's regulations.

10-05-339 Request for Release of Securities – Total Performance

NEW BUSINESS

10-05-340 <u>Municipalities Newfoundland & Labrador (MNL)</u> Municipal Symposium

Councillor Stoyles presented reports that had been provided at the Municipal Symposium for Council's review and consideration. These reports were a result of the Community Development Project undertaken by MNL related to regionalization through the sharing of resources, information, research, training and advisory services.

10-05-341 Bulk Garbage Collection

Councillor Stoyles advised that the first of the three bulk garbage collections for 2010 is nearing completion. Collection for the final zone will take place during the week of May 10th.

Discussion ensued regarding items that are <u>not</u> taken during bulk garbage collection, in particular, construction/renovation materials. It was reported that these items are being collected on an inconsistent basis. It was recommended that the matter be referred to the Public Works Committee for review and a subsequent report that will include protocol, percentage of construction material collected and the rationale for not collecting these items.

10-05-342 <u>Etcetera – Musical Production</u>

Council extended congratulations to all involved in the Etcetera musical production taking place from May 4-8, 2010 at the Glacier. The level of commitment of the cast and crew was acknowledged. The public was encouraged to attend the show.

10-05-343 Webcast – Council Meetings

Councillor Lane commented on the low level of response to the webcasting of council meetings and wondered if this resulted from residents being unaware of the service. It was requested that the Corporate Services Committee consider ways to increase awareness in the community that Council meetings are webcast.

10-05-344 Property Maintenance

Councillor Lane reminded the owners of rental properties that they are responsible for maintaining the properties.

10-05-345 Animal Control – Cats

Councillor Lane reminded residents that cats were not permitted to roam freely outside.

10-05-346 <u>Amendment – Mount Pearl Development Regulations 1988</u>

Offstreet Parking Requirements

In response to Councillor Lane, it was noted that the motion to amend the Development Regulations prohibiting the parking of vehicles on landscaped areas will be referred to a future public council meeting.

10-05-347 Ramp – Ruth Avenue

Councillor Tessier commented on the debris on the sides of the east ramp off Ruth Avenue onto Pitts Memorial Drive. She requested that contact be made with the appropriate authority to have the debris removed.

10-05-348 <u>Household Garbage</u>

Councillor Tessier reminded residents that household garbage is not to be placed to the curb prior to 6:00 am on the day of collection. It was noted that municipal enforcement officers will be issuing tickets for this contravention to the City's Garbage Regulations.

As there was no further business, the meeting adjourned at 5:15 pm on a motion by Councillor Stoyles and seconded by Councillor Tessier.
