PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

15-05-301 Proposed Building Extension, Additional New Access, and Site Improvements St. Peter's Junior High School - 100 Munden Drive

Motion - Councillor Ledwell/Councillor Walsh

RESOLVED THAT the application by the English School District of Newfoundland and Labrador (ESDNL) for a school building extension and additional access to the site at St. Peter's Junior High School be approved and a development permit issued subject to the following conditions AND FURTHER THAT the City have a survey prepared and arrange for lease of the City-owned land required for the additional access to ESDNL:

- 1. the development is approved as outlined in the site plan prepared by Architecture 49 dated October 9, 2014;
- 2. a bus stop currently exists at the foot of the existing walkway at Munden Drive. As this walkway is to be redeveloped as an exit from the school site, the bus stop will need to be relocated; discussion between the School District, Metrobus and the City will be required regarding the relocation of the bus stop.;
- 3. the City currently has landscaping existing in the walkway; this will need to be recovered by the City prior to work occurring in this area.
- 4. the applicant shall install privacy fencing, guardrails, and landscaping for the two residential property owners on either side of the proposed additional access;
- 5. site services shall be in accordance with the requirements and conditions of the City's Engineering Services Division;
- 6. snow clearing on the site will be in such a manner that there is no snow storage to block line of sight for drivers entering and exiting the property or on or near the residential properties on either side of the accesses;
- 7. the City-owned land that is required as part of the site improvement be leased to the ESDNL for a \$1.00; the property that is to form the access road and buffering area into the property shall be surveyed and transferred to the School District, which shall be responsible for the ongoing maintenance, repair and snow clearing of this parcel of property; survey and legal costs shall be the responsibility of the School District; and,

8. the design and construction of the building extension and renovations shall be in accordance with the Mount Pearl Building Regulations, the National Building Code and ancillary codes and the requirements of the building inspector.

<u>Discussion</u>: Councillor Stoyles expressed concern with the impact of the new driveway exit proposed to be developed between the two existing dwellings on Munden Drive (currently an open space walkway area). She noted that the residents would have purchased property knowing the walkway was there but would not have known that the walkway would be widened to accommodate a new access to the School.

Council noted that the proposed parking and traffic circulation improvements at the school site should reduce the current congestion on Munden Drive. This can be monitored by the City after the extension and site improvements are completed to determine if any further action is required to improve traffic circulation on Munden Drive. Council confirmed that every effort will be taken to ensure the applicant follows through with the conditions of the permit and ensure the adjacent properties are protected from future damage.

1. Amend Map 1 – Land Use Zoning Map, as follows:

 rezone a 4154 square metre portion of property directly north-west of 34 Glencoe Drive and south-east of the intersection of Kenmount Road and Bruce Street from Open Space (OS) to Industrial - Light (IL).

The purpose of this amendment is to provide Council with the authority to consider an application for a proposed expansion of an existing development at 34 Glencoe Drive.

NEW BUSINESS

15-05-311 Mount Pearl Minor Hockey Association (MPMHA) – Year-End Awards Banquet

Councillor Stoyles advised that she attended the MPMHA year-end awards banquet and extended congratulations to the players for a great year.

15-05-312 Family Fun Day – Mount Pearl Crime Prevention Committee – April 26

Councillor Stoyles advised that the Family Fun Day was a wonderful success and extended appreciation to all involved. She noted that proceeds raised will be used to support the D.A.R.E. Program and Mount Pearl Crime Prevention events.

15-05-313 Kinette Club of Mount Pearl

Councillor Stoyles advised that the Kinette Club is hosting a fundraiser (Ladies Night) on May 20. It was noted that the Club's new President is Sherry Snow and Councillor Stoyles is the Vice-President.

15-05-314 <u>CIBC – Anniversary Celebrations</u>

Councillor Stoyles advised that CIBC is celebrating their 50^{th} anniversary of being in Mount Pearl on May 12 from 10:00 AM – 12:00 Noon.

15-05-315 Northeast Avalon Joint Council (NEAJC)

Councillor Stoyles advised that the NEAJC will be meeting in Mount Pearl on May 19. She noted that the June meeting (barbeque) will be held in St. John's.

15-05-316 Line Painting

Councillor Walsh advised that the line painting has started and drivers should soon see markings on the streets.

15-05-317 <u>Animal Control – Cats</u>

Councillor Tessier reminded residents that cats are not allowed to roam and must be restricted to the owner's property. This bylaw protects the animal as well as prevents a nuisance problem for property owners.

15-05-318 Impact – Provincial Budget

Councillor Aker advised that the fiscal impact of the provincial budget on the City of Mount Pearl is estimated as follows:

Extra HST to be paid annually	\$250,000
Rebate expected (HST)	\$717,000
Share of gas tax annual basis	\$200,000

The bottom line direct impact on the City's annual budget at the end of a 3 year phase-in period is \$667,000 extra revenue which will offset the loss of the municipal operating grants.

15-05-319 Mount Pearl Lions Club

Councillor Ledwell extended congratulations to the Lions Club on their 59th anniversary charter night. He noted that the Mayor presented the Club with the City's 60th anniversary plaque.

15-05-320 Pearlview West (Moffatt Road) – Phase 4

Council expressed concern that other permits would be issued for the Pearlview West (Moffatt Road) Phase 4 development while there were outstanding deficiencies with previous phases. Council previously granted approval for a clearing and grubbing permit only and directed that building permits not be issued until deficiencies with previous phases were addressed. It was noted that the two deficiencies are the slope in rear of the two properties fronting onto Pollux Drive and the quality of the tree plantings. The developer is currently taking action on the slope and will check the quality of the tree when weather conditions permit.

It was agreed that no further permits would be issued until all deficiencies were addressed. (to be communicated to the residents)

15-05-321 <u>Dumpster – Glenhill Plaza</u>

Deputy Mayor Locke advised that action to enclose the above noted dumpster is currently underway.

15-05-322 ROV Competition

Deputy Mayor Locke extended congratulations to members of the Mount Pearl Senior High and O'Donel High Schools ROV teams on placing 2nd and 3rd respectively at a recent competition. The teams will now compete in the International ROV Competition, being hosted in St. John's June 25-27, at the Marine Institute. It was requested that a letter of congratulations be forwarded to the teams from the Mayor's office.
