13-11-762 Proposed Development Regulations Amendment No. 24, 2013 <u>Text Amendment to Correct Numerical Reference</u> Commercial-General (CG) Use Zone Text Amendment

RESOLVED THAT the proposed Mount Pearl Development Regulation 2010 Amendment No. 24, 2013 be adopted by Council.

<u>Discussion:</u> The purpose of the proposed amendment is to correct an incorrect numerical reference within the text of the CG use zone as follows:

In Section 11.12, USE ZONE SCHEDULES – COMMERCIAL – GENERAL (CG) USE ZONE,

- 1. under sub-section 11.12.1(o):
 - (a) Delete "Hotel (Subject to Regulation 11.11.10)" and replace with "Hotel (Subject to Regulation 11.12.10)".

13-11-763 <u>Proposed Development Regulations 2010 Amendment No. 25, 2013</u> <u>Indoor Parking Facilities Text Amendment</u>

RESOLVED THAT the proposed Mount Pearl Development Regulation 2010 Amendment No. 25, 2013 be adopted by Council.

<u>Discussion:</u> The purpose of the proposed amendment is to provide Council with the authority to regulate indoor parking facilities.

13-11-764 Moffatt Road Subdivision Development – Phase 3 MAE Design Ltd. (Prospect Development Ltd. and Marlay Construction Ltd.) 44-Lot Resdidential Subdivision Development

Motion – Councillor Walsh/Deputy Mayor Locke

RESOLVED THAT a development application for a proposed 44 lot residential subdivision (Phase 3 – Moffatt Road), as submitted by MAE Design Ltd. on behalf of Prospect Development Ltd., be approved with the following conditions to apply as outlined in the technical report dated November 13, 2013:

- Moffatt Road Comprehensive Development Scheme goals, objectives and policies,
- RSU-3 and RMD Land Use Zone requirements,
- Department of Environment & Conservation requirements,
- St. John's Regional Fire Department requirements,
- Newfoundland Power conditions,
- Canada Post conditions,
- Finance Division requirements,
- Planning and Development Department requirements,
- Engineering Services Division / Public Works and Infrastructure Department requirements,
- issuance of a Development Permit,
- signing of a Subdivision Development Agreement by two property owners, and
- municipal and provincial subdivision design standards.

AND FURTHER THAT the conditions in the development permit and agreement reference:

• confirmation of who will be developing individual lots (developers or individual builders);

- lots 12-19 are not to be developed and no building permits issued, until such time as the Wilkes Avenue amendment has been adopted and approved by Council, and the amendment has come legally into effect; and
- the subdivision agreement specify that the developer is to advise all builder and future property owners of proposed lots 1-11 that they are located in the RSU-3 Land Use Zone, and that subsidiary apartments are not a permitted use within the RSU-3 land use zone.

AND FURTHER THAT the Developer be advised that all landscaping, open space, and other requirements of previous phases of the Moffatt Road Development must be completed prior to Council considering any future Phase (Phase 4 and/or others) of the development currently known as the Moffatt Road Development.

<u>Discussion:</u> It was reiterated that the developer would be advised that Council is not prepared to consider approval for Phase 4 until such time all landscaping and open space requirements are fulfilled. It was also noted that residents of Pollux Drive would be made aware of this information should they contact the City.

13-11-765 Proposed Demolition, New Building, Consolidation of Parcels, and Site Work J & P Contracting – 1084-1090 Topsail Road

RESOLVED THAT the application by J. & P. Contracting Inc. to demolish the two existing residential single detached dwellings at 1084 and 1090 Topsail Road, construct a three storey mixed use multi-tenant building with a total floor area of 1864 m², consolidate the two existing parcels and complete associated site work at 1084 - 1090 Topsail Road be approved and a Development Permit issued subject to the following conditions:

- 1. a revised Site Plan to be submitted and approved by Planning and Engineering Services Division prior to the issuance of any Building Permits; the Site Plan shall illustrate the information required as per the City of Mount Pearl Site and Services Plan Development Information Bulletin and any additional information required by all other departments;
- 2. a Landscaping Plan and completed Landscaping Cost Estimate shall be submitted and approved prior to the issuance of any Building Permits;
- 3. 100% Landscaping Security shall be paid prior to the issuance of any Building Permits;
- 4. St. John's Regional Fire Department conditions;
- 5. Newfoundland Power's conditions;
- 6. City Inspector's conditions;
- 7. Finance Divisions conditions;
- 8. Engineering Services conditions; and

9. the development meeting the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010.

Question called. Motion carried unanimously.

13-11-766 <u>Proposed Discretionary Use - Change of Use (Light to General Industry Use)</u> Metal World Inc. - 48 Glencoe Drive

RESOLVED THAT the application by Metal World Inc., to occupy the existing building at 48 Glencoe Drive as a General Industry Use with the building to be utilized for welding and fabricating be approved and a Development Permit be issued subject to the following conditions:

- 2. Occupational Health and Safety's condition, if applicable;
- 3. Planning and Development Department conditions;
- 4. St. John's Regional Fire Department conditions; and,
- 5. The development meeting Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010.

Internship Program - Conservation Corps of NL

An update was provided on the Internship Program with the Conservation Corps of Newfoundland and Labrador. A student has been assigned to Mount Pearl for a 12-week period. The goal of this program is to continue the work begun by the Green Team in establishing a corporate waste management strategy for interested businesses in Mount Pearl.

13-11-773 Power's Pond – Environmental Issue

For the information of the public who may have noticed a muddy run-off into Power's Pond, a stop work order has been issued by the City of St. John's related to development occurring within St. John's that may be causing silt to run into the pond. We have installed silt fences to help contain the silt and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans is continuing to investigate the matter. It was noted that the silt fences installed by the City will be monitored by staff and whether the City will be reimbursed for our resources is yet to be determined.

NEW BUSINESS

13-11-774 Torngat Award

Councillor Walsh commented on the Torngat Award noting that staff deserve the recognition as it was their project and initiative that won the honor. Appreciation was extended to staff throughout the organization for their role in providing a high level of service to residents.
