# 16-11-743 <u>EastLink Wireless Communications Tower Application</u> 756-774 Topsail Road

Information with respect to the appeal process regarding Council's decision to refuse the communications tower in the rear parking area of Mount Pearl Square at 756-774 Topsail Road was provided. It was noted that the applicant has the right to appeal within 14 days of the date of the decision to the Appeal Board at the Department of Municipal Affairs.

Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada (ISEDC) has advised that the applicant has the option to walk away from this location or engage the City again concerning this site or an alternate site. ISEDC engagement is the last resort for resolution. The idea and spirit of ISEDC's default consultation process is for the proponent (Eastlink) to work with the land use authority (LUA, City of Mount Pearl) to identify suitable locations. ISEDC only becomes involved if the applicant files a formal impasse with ISEDC when all options have been exhausted.

With respect to ISEDC informing residents of its decision, the City was advised that ISEDC's decision would be communicated to Eastlink and the City of Mount Pearl not to residents. It was agreed that the City would notify residents of the outcome of Eastlink's review and their chosen site.

It was noted that the applicant is currently assessing other options in the area and will update the City on their plans moving forward once these options have been investigated.

# 16-11-752 Proposed Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 Amendment No. 59, 2016 Indoor Firearms Shooting Range Amendment

RESOLVED THAT Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 Amendment No. 59, 2016 (Indoor Firearms Shooting Range Amendment) be adopted and submitted to the Department of Municipal Affairs for registration.

<u>Discussion:</u> The purpose of the proposed amendment is to provide Council with the authority to consider a proposed development application by Fougere Menchenton Architecture Inc. to develop a multi-use building consisting of a combined recreational vehicle sales and service use and indoor firearms shooting range at 1246-1260 Topsail Road.

In addition, this amendment will define Indoor Firearms Shooting Range, outline the conditions and parking requirements for the use, and identify the use as a discretionary use within the Commercial – Mixed (CM) and Industrial - Light (IL) use zones, and provide Council with the authority to further consider the proposed discretionary development application.

<u>Discussion:</u> The purpose of the proposed amendment is to provide Council with the authority to consider a proposed development application by Fougere Menchenton Architecture Inc. to develop a multi-use building consisting of a combined recreational vehicle sales and service use and indoor firearms shooting range at 1246-1260 Topsail Road.

In addition, this amendment will define below grade development, add below grade development to Section 6 – General Development Standards, outline the general provisions required in order for below grade development to occur, and provide Council with the authority to consider below grade or underground development.

1. In Section 11, Use Zone Schedules; subsection 11.19, Industrial - Light (IL) Zone; subsection 11.19.2, Discretionary Uses; subsection 11.19.2 (r), Significant Telecommunications Structure; change "Subject to Regulation 7.26.2" to "Subject to Regulation 7.27.2"

The purpose of this amendment is to correct a numbering error identified in the Development Regulations.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### 16-11-759 Open House – Green Space - Truxton Place/Pollux Drive

Deputy Mayor Locke extended appreciation to the residents who attended an open house for the development of the Pollux Drive/Truxton Place green space. He noted that the residents' input will be considered and a subsequent report prepared for Council's consideration.

#### 16-11-760 Mount Pearl Minor Hockey Association (MPMHA) – Annual Food Drive

Members of Council extended appreciation to the organizers, hockey players and other volunteers who participated in the 5<sup>th</sup> annual MPMHA food drive. It was noted that over \$3,000 in cash donations and 25,000 pieces of food were collected and will be divided between the two Mount Pearl food banks.

Councillor Aker suggested that the volunteers may wish to consider for a future event providing assistance at the food bank locations given the amount of food that needs to be sorted.

#### 16-11-761 <u>Staff Christmas Social</u>

Members of Council commented on the success of the recent staff social and extended appreciation to staff for all they do.

#### 16-11-762 <u>Canada Post</u>

Councillor Stoyles advised that complaints continue to be received concerning community mailboxes and suggested that residents may wish to contact MP Seamus O'Regan regarding their concerns.

#### 16-11-763 <u>Municipal Avenue Development</u>

Councillor Stoyles reiterated her concerns with the monthly rent being charged for the affordable housing units in the Municipal Avenue development. She provided information on rental rates and waiting lists for Masonic Park and St. Luke's as well as NL Housing.

Discussion ensued on the term "affordable housing" and the intent of the Municipal Avenue development. It was clarified that the units were not meant to be to be offered as subsidized units. However, it was agreed that there was a need in the community given the long wait lists. Housing is considered to be affordable when a household spends less than 25% of income on shelter.

#### 16-11-764 Toy Donations

Councillor Tessier advised of the need for children's toys for Christmas and encouraged residents to donate to the St. Vincent de Paul Society, Salvation Army, or another charity.

#### 16-11-765 Santa Claus Parade

Councillor Ledwell reminded residents of the Santa Claus Parade taking place on Saturday, December 3, starting at 10:00 AM from Mount Pearl Senior High School parking lot.

#### 16-11-766 Swim Meet

Councillor Ledwell advised that the Mount Pearl Marlins is hosting a swim meet from December 2 – 4 at the Summit Centre. The "Body Quest Sink or Swim Invitational" will have 390 swimmers registered from all over Newfoundland & Labrador as well as St. Pierre.
