<u>Discussion</u>: It was clarified that item 15 represented the purchase of nets/posts for the tennis courts not the privacy netting that covered the chain link fence during the playing season. ENGINEERING SERVICES COMMITTEE

13-11-729 <u>Multiplex - Update</u>

Council was provided with an update on the Multiplex.

In response to an inquiry by council, the Director of Infrastructure & Public Works was requested to clarify whether there were changes to the parking lot with respect to additional parking stalls being installed in the area down from the Glacier towards the Reid Community Centre. It was noted that there was a slight change in the parking stalls configuration on the main lot (an increase of 20 spaces).

PLANNING AND LAND USE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

13-11-730 <u>Proposed Single Family Dwelling Development</u> 28 Mount Carson Avenue

Initial application for a single-family dwelling development at 28 Mount Carson Avenue was refused by Council in January of 2013 on the basis of prohibiting any further accesses onto Mount Carson Avenue. The property owners were so advised, and proceeded to appeal Council's decision. The Appeal Board ordered the following:

- a. that the decision of the City of Mount Pearl to refuse the property owner's application for a single dwelling at 28 Mount Carson Avenue be vacated;
- b. that the City of Mount Pearl pay an amount of money equal to the appeal filing fee of \$113.00 paid by the appellant; and
- c. that the City of Mount Pearl revisit the application to construct a single dwelling at 28 Mount Carson Avenue to ensure compliance with the Urban

and Rural Planning Act, 2001 and the City of Mount Pearl Municipal Plan and Development Regulations, 2010.

The Appeal Board directed Council to consider the application again and make a decision based on the current plans and regulations in effect.

Motion - Councillor Aker/Councillor Ledwell

RESOLVED THAT the application for a single-family dwelling at 28 Mount Carson Avenue be refused, based on:

- 1. the proposal is contrary to Section 7.6.1 of the Mount Pearl Municipal Plan 2010 as the new access will contribute to adversely affecting the efficiency of Mount Carson Avenue; and
- 2. pursuant to Regulation 4.5, the proposed access is contrary to the intent of Regulation 6.1.1 which provides Council with the authority to ensure the greatest possible convenience and safety of the street system.

<u>Discussion:</u> It was noted that the applicants had been advised prior to purchasing the property of the issue with respect to gaining access on Mount Carson Avenue. Council was advised that the applicant would be willing to work within the proposed development plan provided a temporary access to one of the lots off Mount Carson Avenue would be provided – to be closed upon Macroom Place being developed. Council reiterated their position not to have an access from Mount Carson Avenue and questioned the status of the development of Macroom Place. (Director to follow up with developer.)

Question called. Motion carried unanimously.

13-11-731 Proposed Mount Pearl Municipal Plan 2010 Amendment No. 6, 2013; and Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 Amendment No. 22, 2013 (Worrall Crescent Amendment)

Motion – Councillor Aker/Councillor Ledwell

RESOLVED THAT the Mount Pearl Municipal Plan 2010 Amendment No. 6, 2013 and Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 Amendment No. 22, 2013 be adopted; the public hearing proceed on November 26, 2013 and Gerard Lewis be appointed the Commissioner.

<u>Discussion:</u> The intention of this proposed amendment is to provide Council with the authority to consider a multi-unit residential development fronting onto Worrall Crescent.

Question called. Motion carried unanimously.

13-11-732 <u>Proposed Mixed Use Building (Apartment Building and Commercial Uses)</u> Kavanagh Associates - 137-141 Commonwealth Avenue

Motion - Councillor Aker/Councillor Ledwell

RESOLVED THAT the application by Kavanagh Associates proposing a six (6) storey mixed use building consisting of mixed commercial uses on the first level and 49 residential condos on the above five levels at 137-141 Commonwealth Avenue be approved and a development permit issued subject to the conditions of the City departments and external authorities (as outlined in the Committee report dated October 22, 2013).

13-11-733 <u>Pearl Awards for Urban Design and Gardens 2013</u> Awards Presentation Ceremony – November 7, 2013

Information was presented on the 2013 Pearl Awards for Urban Design and Gardens taking place on Thursday, November 7, 2013, at 7:00 pm, in the Council Chambers.

13-11-734 Notice of Motion

Amendment – Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010

Councillor Aker gave notice that in accordance with Section 39 of the City of Mount Pearl Act, 1988 and in accordance with Council's public notification policy, he will, at a regular meeting of Council, move an amendment to the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010, that, if enacted, will:

Amend Map 1 – Land Use Zoning Map, as follows:

Relocate the boundary between the Conservation (CON) and Commercial Mixed (CM) use zones at 959 and 963 Topsail Road to coincide with the top of the slope of the subject properties.

The purpose of this proposed amendment is to relocate the designation and zoning boundary to fully include the rear yards of these properties up to the limit of the top of the slope into the Commercial Mix use zone for the purpose of bringing the designation and zoning boundary in line with the existing topography of these properties and to provide the Council with the authority to consider the proposed expansion of an existing gravel equipment and storage yard.

13-11-735 <u>Development Permits</u>
