16-10-633 <u>Campia Gymnastics / City of Mount Pearl</u> <u>Lease Agreement & Loan Agreement</u>

RESOLVED THAT approval be granted to execute the loan agreement and lease agreement between the City of Mount Pearl and Campia Gymnastics as negotiated.

Question called. Motion carried unanimously.

16-10-634 Ratification of the Collective Agreement with CUPE 2099-1 (Glacier)

For the information of the public, an agreement has been reached with CUPE Local 2099-1 and is effective from May 1, 2016 to June 30, 2018. The negotiations resulted in a synergy of the collective agreements between the Glacier and the City for operational consistency, while retaining the uniqueness of operational requirements within an ice arena (e.g. hours of work, pay for shift work, etc.); the introduction of a defined contribution pension plan option into the available pension options; an agreement that the Glacier union will merge with the City CUPE Local 2099 in 2018 so there will be one set of negotiations for all City staff in future. Wage increases were consistent with the wage package provided in 2014 to CUPE Local 2099 and included:

- A one-time adjustment of \$0.32 per hour effective September 15, 2015
- May 1, 2016 \$0.82 per hour
- May 1, 2017 \$1.00 per hour
