## PLANNING AND LAND USE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

10-10-754 <u>CJ Enterprises</u> <u>Home Based Business (Discretionary Use) and Renovations (Expansion</u> <u>and Nonconforming Use) – 872 Topsail Road</u>

Motion – Councillor Aker/Councillor Tessier

RESOLVED THAT a development application from CJ Enterprises to renovate the existing single family dwelling and undertake site improvements at 872 Topsail Road be refused for the following reasons:

 Pursuant to Regulation 10 of the Mount Pearl Development Regulations, the proposal does not constitute a home based business as envisioned by Council's Municipal Plan policies and Development Regulations and this type of development proposal will prejudice the transition of this property to a full commercial property as envisioned in the Mount Pearl Municipal Plan. An investment of this magnitude to the existing dwelling, which will result in the dwelling being partially used for both

residential and commercial purposes, will make the transition more difficult and less likely to occur in the foreseeable future.

 The addition of the solariums at the front of the dwelling is increasing the gross floor area of the dwelling which is contrary to condition 10.1(vi) of the Mixed Development (MD) use zone of the Mount Pearl Development Regulations.

<u>Discussion:</u> It was noted that there are a number of properties that are in transition from residential to commercial. It is planned to move forward with developing such areas into proper commercial establishments.

Question called. Motion carried unanimously.

## 10-10-755 Confirmation of Order - Contravention of Regulations Commercial General Garage Use and Parking of Taxi Cabs 2 Forest Avenue

RESOLVED THAT the Order to the property owner of 2 Forest Avenue regarding the use of an accessory building as a commercial general garage and the parking of a number of taxi cabs at the property, as issued on September 30, 2010, be ratified as per the Urban & Rural Planning Act 2000.

<u>Discussion</u>: Council was advised of discussions with and correspondence from the property owner since the Order was issued. While this correspondence is under review, no action will be taken. It was noted that a number of complaints have been received regarding this property.
