<u>Subdivision of Land and Replacement of a Single Dwelling with a Double</u> Dwelling (Two Semi-Detached Units) – 3 Orchard Avenue

RESOLVED THAT the proposal by DCM Development to demolish the existing dwelling, subdivide and create two (2) building lots and develop a Double Dwelling at 3 Orchard Avenue be approved and that a development permit be issued subject to the following conditions:

- the development meeting the conditions and requirements as set out by the Planning and Development Department, the Community Services Department and the Engineering Services Division.

11-09-615 <u>Hillside Living Subdivision Development – Phase 1A2</u> Subdivision Development Agreement

RESOLVED THAT approval be granted for the Mayor and Chief Administrative Officer to sign the Hillside Living Phase 1A2 Subdivision Development Agreement on behalf of the City Council of Mount Pearl.

NEW BUSINESS

11-09-619 <u>School Opening – Motorists</u>

Councillor Tessier urged drivers to use caution and keep safety in mind as students return to school.

11-09-620 Development

Councillor Lane suggested that consideration be given to rezoning areas, such as Blackmarsh Road, to a commercial or office use. He indicated that given the limited residential development available this would be a way to increase the tax base.

11-09-621 Leave of Absence

Councillor Lane advised that when the writ is issued (September 20, 2011) for the Provincial Election he will commence a leave of absence from Council.

Deputy Mayor Locke questioned whether consideration was given to extending the use of the park patrol until later in the fall given the opening of school and the possibility of increased activity in the trails. It was indicated that Community Services would investigate the option.

11-09-623 <u>Traffic Lights</u>

In response to Deputy Mayor Locke, it was noted that the City's traffic lights have some form of traffic activation, either buried (most dependable and installed well below the surface) or surface (installed very close to the surface of the asphalt in saw cuts). At present most of our traffic loops are of the surface variety, however, each year some are removed and replaced with buried detectors. This year the loop detectors at Smallwood/Old Placentia and Ruth/Old Placentia are being upgraded.

11-09-624 Animal Control

Councillor Stoyles advised of a report of an untethered dog on a trail off Park Avenue. It was requested that animal control patrol the area.

11-09-625 Church of the Good Shepherd

Councillor Stoyles advised of a weekly (Wednesday) free community lunch program run by the Church of the Good Shepherd Parish.

11-09-626 <u>Soccer Challenge Cup Teams</u>

Councillor Walsh extended congratulations to the men's and ladies Challenge Cup teams on well played games.

11-09-627 <u>Condolences – Fleet Family</u>

Councillor Walsh extended condolences to the Fleet family, in particular to Harold Fleet Jr., a City employee, on the passing of Harold Fleet Sr. It was noted that Mr. Fleet was a very involved in Mount Pearl and also served as a member of council for a year.

11-09-628 Campia Gymnastics – Building Proposal

Councillor Walsh extended appreciation to all involved in the Campia Gymnastics building proposal and public consultation process. He noted that it will be a great development for the city and the surrounding area.
