10-09-654 Adoption of Agenda

BUSINESS ARISING

10-09-656 <u>Hillside Subdivision Development</u>

Council was advised that contact was made with the developer, who indicated that discussions are taking place with a contractor to have work completed. Given that the area in front of the entrance to Gadwall Place remains in disrepair, it is assumed the developer did not reach an agreement with the contractor. It was agreed that sufficient time had been provided to the developer to undertake this work.

<u>Motion</u> – Councillor Tessier/Councillor Stoyles

RESOLVED THAT City forces repair the area fronting the entrance to Gadwall Place with associated costs being recovered from the developer.

Question called. Motion carried unanimously.

10-09-657 On-Line Swim Registration

Council commented on the on-line swim registration, noting that although there were some technical difficulties, overall the process went well. Staff will continue to work with the service provider, Book King, to refine the process. The general program registration that started today's date was running well with little, or no, technical difficulties. The Director advised that approximately 50% of the participants registered on line.

10-09-658 Mount Pearl Arts Week

Mayor Simms signed a proclamation declaring September 11 – 17, 2010 as Mount Pearl Arts Week. Christine Hennebury, Chairperson, Association for the Arts in Mount Pearl, and Katie Little, an employee with the Association were welcomed. Ms. Hennebury expanded upon the activities planned for the week and expressed appreciation to Council for their support.

10-09-659 Sexual Violence Awareness Week

10-09-660 Minister of Finance

A letter was presented from The Honourable James Flaherty, Minister of Finance, responding to the Mayor's letter of March 1, 2010 regarding support for municipal infrastructure under Canada's Economic Action Plan and other federal infrastructure programs. Minister Flaherty confirmed the Government's deadline of March 31, 2011 to complete projects.

10-09-661 Report – Regional Fire Services Committee

Councillor Walsh presented a Regional Fire Services Committee report resulting from the Committee's meeting of September 1, 2010. Council concurred with the Committee's recommendation of the hiring process for firefighters.

RESOLVED THAT the City of Mount Pearl, as a member of the Regional Fire Services Committee, support the introduction of a yearly departmental awareness program structured similarly to Camp FFIT (Ottawa) and Camp Glow (Marine Institute) by the St. John's Regional Fire Department.

<u>Discussion:</u> The purpose of this program is to provide females an opportunity to obtain a general awareness of what is involved in fire fighting and subsequently determine if they wish to pursue such a profession. This yearly program would be developed and introduced in 2011.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, COMMUNICATION AND TOURISM COMMITTEE REPORT

10-09-671 Gateway Signage Project – Tract Consulting

A status report on the gateway signage project was presented. It was confirmed that reflective material would be used as solar panels had been deemed too costly. The Provincial Government has received the City's application and verbally approved the proposed locations – Pitts Memorial Drive, east bound of exit 41A of the TCH and Pitts Memorial Drive, west bound, northeast of Pearltown Road underpass for location of these signs. Copies of the construction drawings for the signs were presented and these drawings will be used for the tender call documents, from which the successful bidder will base their final design drawings and landscaping for the signs. It is anticipated that the tender call will be advertised in the September 11th edition of The Telegram, with a closing date of September 24th. Depending on the work schedules of the local sign companies, the signs may be erected later this fall or early spring 2011.

It was requested that the drawings be placed on the City's website.

10-09-672 Upgrading of Entrance Signs to Donovans Business Park

RESOLVED THAT the quotation for the fabricating and installation of brushed aluminum dibond panels with vinyl lettering to the faces of the entrance signs to Donovans Business Park and painting of the sides, grooves and reverse of the signs be awarded to the low bidder, Barnes Graphics Art & Signs, in the amount of \$2,321.00 (plus HST).

10-09-676 Mount Pearl Development Regulations Amendment No. 206, 2010 Pearlgate Hotel Amendment Olympic Drive Site

The intention of the proposed regulation amendment is to recognize that a commercial residential use (hotel, motel or residential club) is a permitted use in the GC use zone in the Pearlgate Recreation Centre area and the development of the site shall be in accordance with the conditions outlined in the Council's Request for Proposals (RFP) for the hotel development in this area. Currently, commercial residential use is a discretionary use.

RESOLVED THAT Amendment No. 206, 2010 (Pearlgate Hotel Amendment) be approved as presented.

10-09-680 <u>Draft Mount Pearl City Plan 2010 and Development Regulations</u>

Council was provided with an update on the preparation of the City Plan 2010 and development regulations through a public consultation process titled "Advancing the Vision", that commenced in 1995, and included a series of public notices, open houses, information sessions, website postings and private consultations. This public consultation process ended in January 2010.

Over the next several weeks, the Planning and Development Department will proceed with the final public consultation by planning an open house and briefing session, distributing the notice of these meetings via newspaper advertisement and mail out to affected property owners, and placing the revised documents on the City's website. Following this public consultation, the documents will be reviewed and revised if necessary by Council, and then referred to the Department of Municipal Affairs for provincial review and release. Once released by the Department of Municipal Affairs, the documents will then come forward to Council again for adoption.

The Mayor commented on the regional plan process noting that it shouldn't impact with our process for proceeding with the City of Mount Pearl plan and that we should have a new plan by year end.
