<u>Discussion</u>: It was acknowledged that this year's bid was less than the 2016 contract however that contract included paving of some parking lots. It was confirmed that other than a small increase in unit costs due to size increases requested for crosswalk blocks and inclusion of stop bars, all other unit prices were the same as last year. Work will commence when weather conditions permit and Council asked that it start at the busiest intersections.
