PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

19-03-152 Proposed Amendment to Mount Pearl Building Regulations Updating to Reflect Current Practices, and General Review

RESOLVED THAT the amendments to the City of Mount Pearl Building Regulations 2019, as presented, be adopted.

The purpose of the City of Mount Pearl Building Regulations Amendment is to provide Council with the authority to regulate building within the City, in a manner to:

- bring the regulations up to date with current information, terminology, and accepted practices,
- reflect the City's current organizational structure, without altering intent of the current regulations, and

• correct minor errors, clarify phrasing, and improve formatting without altering intent of the current regulations.

The Committee was advised of the following public works maintenance updates:

- Salt Usage for 2019 is down compared to previous year.
- Snow removal continues (blow back, cul-de-sacs, sidewalks, fire hydrants). Snow
 clearing operations are undertaken on a priority-based plan for the clearing of
 snow from streets and sidewalks. Melting of snow/ice isn't feasible as melt could
 turn to icy conditions if the temperature drops.
- Pothole repairs are ongoing. Members of the public were encouraged to report
 potholes for repairs. It was indicated that there may be an increase in potholes
 given the recent cold temperatures followed by the increase in temperatures.
 Potholes are caused by the expansion and contraction of ground water after it has
 accumulated under the asphalt.

19-03-164 Condolences – Tulk

Members of Council extended condolences to the family and friends of Ian Tulk. It was noted that Mr. Tulk was an employee of BAE Newplan and a volunteer in the community.

19-03-165 Resignation – Ed Grant

Members of Council acknowledged with appreciation the contribution made by Mr. Grant during his tenure as Chairperson of the Eastern Regional Service Board.

It was noted that Councillor Stoyles is Mount Pearl's representative on the Board. Reference was made to the Province's review of the waste management strategy and the amendment to the Regional Service Boards Act.

19-03-166 Protest – Climate Change

Deputy Mayor Locke acknowledged the recent efforts by students who supported the global movement for climate change.

19-03-167 New Zealand Shootings - Christchurch Mosques

Deputy Mayor Locke publicly condemned the intolerance that resulted in the brutal killings in New Zealand. On behalf of Council, he extended deepest condolences to those grieving. It was requested that a letter under the Mayor's signature be forwarded letting their residents know that this atrocity has touched us as well.

Councillor Power also spoke of the tragedy and the card-making event organized to send a message to the Muslim community in St. John's that hate will not be tolerated here.

19-03-168 <u>Janeway Telethon Launch – Newtown Elementary</u>

Councillor Fry spoke of the launch of the Janeway Telethon at Newtown Elementary. She extended appreciation to Principal Vikki Anstey, students and NTV.

19-03-169 Focus on Youth Awards

Councillor Fry advised that the deadline for nomination submissions is March 25 and encouraged people to submit nominations.

19-03-170 Bulk Garbage

Councillor Fry reminded residents that the bulk garbage collection will resume in April and May as well as September and October in accordance with the neighbourhood zone schedule. During June, July and August residents can request a maximum of two collections free of charge. If a collection is required at any other time, there is a service available for a prepaid fee of \$45. She also encouraged residents to donate any serviceable furniture and household items to Home Again Furniture for those in need.
