INFRASTRUCTURE AND PUBLIC WORKS

19-04-222 Contract Award - Glacier 1 Rink Board Replacement CPR19004

19-04-226 Capital Works Update

An update on upcoming capital works projects was presented. It was noted that the street markings tender, which closed on April 15, will be awarded at the next public council meeting. In the meantime, temporary markings have been placed on the main streets in the city. The operation of street markings will begin when conditions permit the paint to adhere to the road. It was indicated that staff continue to investigate longer lasting solutions and improvements in the application of line painting. Reference was also made to a research project undertaken by Memorial University. Referred to IPW for follow up.

19-04-227 T'Railway Resurfacing

The City has received funding, \$80,000, from Trans Canada Trail, for T'Railway Resurfacing. The City will be adding \$200,000 to complete the project.

The project scope includes:

- 6.1 kilometers of trail re-surface, to a 3m width
- 5 (Trail counters) pedestrian counters for data management of trail use
- 4 gates, 10 benches
