This forum was organized by Health Canada for participants to learn about differences in jurisdictional approaches to legalization and regulation; and, collectively discuss challenges and potential solutions to ensure an effective transition to a fully regulated cannabis regime.

RESOLVED THAT the following resolution endorsing Mayor Aker to serve on the FCM Board of Directors as the representative of the NL cities be approved:

WHEREAS the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) represents the interests of municipalities on policy and program matters that fall within federal jurisdiction;

WHEREAS FCM's Board of Directors is comprised of elected municipal officials from all regions and sizes of communities to form a broad base of support and provide FCM with the prestige required to carry the municipal message to the federal government; and

WHEREAS FCM's Annual Conference and Trade Show will take place May 30 – June 2, 2019, during which time the Annual General Meeting will be held and followed by the election of FCM's Board of Directors;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Mount Pearl endorses Mayor Aker to stand for election on FCM's Board of Directors for the period starting in June 2019 and ending in June 2021; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Council assumes all costs associated with Mayor Dave Aker attending FCM's Board of Directors meetings.

19-04-198 <u>Discretionary Use Application</u>

Atlantic Cultivation Ltd. - 142 Clyde Avenue

RESOLVED THAT the discretionary use application as per sections 3.7, 4.5, 4.11.2, 4.17, 4.18, 4.20, 6.19, 7.15, and 11.19 of the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010, as submitted by Atlantic Cultivation Ltd. to construct a new building with a floor area of approximately 10,220 m² at 142 Clyde Avenue, including construction of a new building, associated site work, and the consolidation of 138 and 142 Clyde Avenue and 135 Glencoe Drive, be approved and a Development Permit be issued subject to the conditions set out by the Department of Community Development.

Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010

Councillor Antle gave notice that in accordance with Section 39 of the *City of Mount Pearl Act,* RSNL 1990, C-16 and with Council's public notification policy, he would, at a regular meeting of Council, move amendments to the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 that, if enacted, would amend the text of the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 as follows:

In Section 7 Special Developments, under Subsection 7.15 General Industry and Hazardous Industry Uses, remove subsubsection 7.15.2 current wording of, "bulk storage of flammable and hazardous liquids and substances shall be limited in volume to a maximum capacity of eight hundred thousand (800,000) litres." and replace with, "bulk storage of flammable liquids shall conform to the requirements of the Provincial Fire Commissioner."

The purpose of this amendment is to ensure that the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 are consistent with current provincial regulations and are not contrary to any other regional requirements.

RESOLVED THAT the Request for Proposals (RFP) for the Power's Pond Storm Water Quality Management Feasibility Study #CPR19002 be awarded to the consultant with the highest score, technical and financial combined, SNC Lavalin, for the bid amount of \$38,320.88 (HST included).

This project is within available budget – combination of Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) Grant and City contribution (50/50). The project completion date is June 30, 2019.
