19-04-261 Proposed Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 Amendment No. 70, 2019
Bulk Storage Amendment

RESOLVED THAT the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 Amendment No. 70, 2019 – Bulk Storage Amendment - be adopted and submitted to the Department of Municipal Affairs and Environment for registration.

The purpose of this amendment is to ensure that the Mount Pearl Development Regulations 2010 are consistent with current provincial regulations and not contrary to any other regional requirements.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND PUBLIC WORKS

19-04-264 Public Works Update

An update on public works operations was presented. It was noted that snow clearing operations will continue when conditions warrant to ensure safety for residents and drivers. This includes clearing of lots around City facilities. Information was also provided on the "Key2Access" technology (a mobile phone app used by pedestrians living with sight loss that will activate the walk signal at intersections). The pedestrian signals located at Centennial/Commonwealth, Ruth/Commonwealth and Topsail/Commonwealth intersections will be updated with the technology. It was indicated that the CNIB will share the information with their clients and the City will also communicate with residents. Bulk garbage collection has commenced in accordance with the zone schedule. Residents were encouraged to consider donating items still in good condition to the Home Again Furniture Bank.
