RESOLVED THAT approval be granted to award the Request for Proposals for Design – Build Services for the Traffic and Pedestrian Lights at Moffatt Road, Humber

Drive and Topsail Road intersection be awarded to the highest overall score out of 100, Black and McDonald Ltd., for the bid amount of \$489,637.80 (HST included).

<u>Discussion:</u> It was confirmed that the lights would include traffic sensors but not include the "Key2Access" technology at this time. It was noted that these lights would provide a safer access for users to connect to the trail system in the north end of the city to the south.
