It was her position that the program should be used to attract new businesses to the city not existing businesses. <u>Discussion</u>: It was noted that the City was recently awarded \$212,986.00 (or 73.33%) in funding under the Federal and Provincial Climate Change Challenge Fund for the recent submission of energy efficiency projects. This project was approved and allocated in the 2020 budget and includes important climate change initiatives from the City's Climate Change Action Plan, namely the conversion of our park shed from oil to electric heat, and the use of recyclable oil filters in the heavy equipment fleet.

NEW BUSINESS

20-02-085 Masonic Park

Councillor Stoyles advised that Masonic Park reached out to the Mount Pearl Minor Hockey Association for assistance to help clear windows following the blizzard. She extended appreciation to the players who responded to the request for help.

20-02-086 <u>Student Summer Employment Program – Post-Secondary</u>

Councillor Stoyles advised that applications are now being accepted for the above program. The program provides a subsidy to assist private sector and not-for-profit organizations which include school districts and municipalities to create summer jobs for post-secondary students entering or returning to post-secondary studies in the upcoming school year. 20-02-087 <u>Condolences – Ralph</u>

Councillor Stoyles extended condolences to the family and friends of Wayne Ralph. She acknowledged Mr. Ralph's contributions to the community and that he was also a former union leader.

Councillor Stoyles extended condolences to the family and friends of Keith Osmond, longtime operator and owner of Osmond's Garage.

20-02-090 <u>Cineplex</u>

Councillor Stoyles expressed disappointment about not being notified of the Cineplex application for a liquor license prior to reading about it in the media. It was acknowledged that because there was no change of use at the cinema (i.e. creation of a lounge or putting up walls), it did not require a public notice. Councillor Ledwell and Deputy Mayor Locke also commented, noting that Planning staff process many applications that do not need Council approval and it may be difficult to determine what may be a controversial item.

20-02-091 Snow Clearing

Deputy Mayor Locke commented on complaints of ice chunks left in driveways by the City's snow clearing equipment following the recent snow/rain event. He noted that it was the nature of the event and there was little to be done other than take preventive measures by those who can. Appreciation was extended to the City's operators who have been working steadily since Christmas.

Councillors Antle and Ledwell extended congratulations to all nominees and winners of the Chamber's recent Best in Business Awards. The efforts of the Chamber on behalf of their members were acknowledged with appreciation.

Councillor Ledwell extended appreciation to Chairperson Robert Hayes, the Frosty Board and the many volunteers for all they've done to create the signature event that the Festival has become. He noted there was an exciting line up of activities and encouraged the public to attend the many events.
