20-05-091 Adoption of Agenda

RESOLVED THAT the agenda be adopted as presented.

BUSINESS ARISING

20-05-093 NF Power – Smallwood Drive Project

Councillor Stoyles commented on the meeting held with NF Power officials regarding the Smallwood Drive project. She indicated that the meeting was informative, however, her concern was with communication and as some residents still had concerns felt a public meeting (video conference) was required. Councillor Fry noted that she was not opposed to the upgrades but suggested that a compromise could be considered, i.e. explore the possibility of keeping the poles at the rear of the properties. Councillor Antle questioned whether there was a consensus from the residents. Mayor Aker advised that NF Power has reached the majority of residents, and the usual process by staff was undertaken with respect to this project. He noted that it was not a Planning issue but was processed through the Engineering Division. Deputy Mayor Locke noted that there is no formal permit required; NF Power consults with the Engineering Division for a technical review. Councillor Ledwell noted that there appeared to be a breakdown in communications and perhaps a sufficient explanation wasn't presented to the residents. He noted that it was not only intended to improve access to the poles but there have been concerns about inadequate lighting in the area, particularly around the Team Gushue Complex. It was noted that an update will be presented at the next public council meeting.

20-05-094 Private Sewer Repairs

Deputy Mayor Locke advised that private sewer repairs were not discontinued, there was a procedure in place to accommodate residents' requests while ensuring the safety of staff during COVID-19. He noted that UTM staff are needed for other services (i.e. water main breaks) and this service would be compromised should staff get sick. He further advised that staff are continuing to review the service and reviewing an SOP, which when drafted, will be referred to the IPW Committee.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

20-05-096 <u>Event Cancellations Due to COVID-19</u>

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the City has cancelled the annual Canada Day and City Days celebrations. This decision was made as a result of public health orders that prevent large gatherings at any indoor or outdoor locations. The City continues to make decisions based on the direction of public health and the health and welfare of its residents and employees. <u>Discussion</u>: It was noted that since UTM started the leak detection program, the City's water consumption has gone down considerably year over year. At the beginning of 2019, the projected cost for water was \$0.6294, however, the actual cost of maintenance was \$0.52544 and subsequently adjusted in the billings (reducing total annual water bill by over \$475,000), which when the City's share of

capital expenditures related to water maintenance of roughly \$62,000 was added, gives the actual water surplus of \$411,000.
