BUSINESS ARISING

20-06-160 Hotel Mount Pearl 1 – 5 Park Avenue

Council was advised of complaints regarding the length of time it is taking for the demolition of Hotel Mount Pearl. For the information of the public, an appeal of the City's Order has been filed with the Eastern Regional Appeal Board on the basis that demolition and clean-up can only proceed upon receiving a response from Occupational Health and Safety in relation to the asbestos testing results. Staff has reached out to the Department of Municipal Affairs and Environment, the Appeal Board and the City's solicitor to determine what can be done. A further update should be available for the next public council meeting.

20-06-161 <u>Bulk Garbage Collection</u>

The public was advised that bulk garbage collection will take place in July and August by appointment. Scheduling started on June 15 and resulted in many calls for appointments. Consideration is being given to ways to respond to the demand.

Professional Consultant Services for Pedestrian Walkway Underpass Remediation

Proposed Upgrading for 2020

Smallwood Drive, Blossom Avenue and Park Avenue

Councillor Stoyles advised that following the public response to the installation of poles on Smallwood Drive, steps were taken to immediately pause the project. The City wrote to Newfoundland Power on June 10, 2020, through the Director of Infrastructure and Public Works, to "stop any installation of poles and/or wires in the Smallwood Drive right-of-way."

The City is currently working closely with Newfoundland Power to better understand if there are other feasible alternatives and what the impact of those alternatives will be to residents and businesses. The City values the feedback received and wants to work together with Newfoundland Power, residents, and businesses to find the most reliable and least impactful option. More information on this public engagement will be available in the coming weeks.

NEW BUSINESS

20-06-177 <u>Eastern Health and Northeast Avalon Joint Council Meeting</u>

Councillor Antle provided an update on the above meeting, noting that Eastern Health is gradually increasing services, currently close to 65% operational capacity.

20-06-178 Complaints of Roaming Cats

Councillor Antle commented on the increased number of roaming cat complaints and reminded residents that, in accordance with the Animal Control Regulations, cats are not permitted to roam.

20-06-179 Library Board

Councillor Antle advised that the Library Board is working with the Province on the gradual resumption of services. He noted that NL Public Libraries were considering curbside services at select sites, however, it could not be confirmed if the Ross King Memorial Public Library would be included at this time.

20-06-180 Mount Pearl Foodbanks Fundraiser

Councillor Antle advised that the GoFundMe campaign implemented by the Mount Pearl Community Supper Group ends on June 30. He noted that over \$12,000 has been raised through a combination of this platform as well as direct donations to the foodbanks. Appreciation was extended to everyone who donated; the group will continue to explore fundraising opportunities as there is an ongoing need for support.

20-06-181 Mount Pearl Seniors Independence Group (MPSIG)

Councillor Stoyles advised that the MPSIG has hired a summer student to do odd jobs for members. Further information is available by contacting their office.

20-06-182 Kinette Club

Councillors Stoyles and Fry extended appreciation and congratulations to the Kinette Club for raising over \$11,000 through their Hearts for Hope fundraising campaign. Funds will be used in the community to assist those in need.

20-06-183 <u>Mount Pearl Youth Opportunity Fund Foundation</u>

Councillor Stoyles commented on the Rogers family (Rogers Communication) \$25,000 donation to the Youth Opportunity Fund and extended appreciation for this generous contribution. The Foundation provides funding that focuses on "youth helping youth" empowering youth through new and innovative opportunities. 20-06-184 Appreciation – Employee Gary Lewis

Deputy Mayor Locke advised of a resident's email complimenting Water and Sewer Foreperson, Gary Lewis, for going above and beyond to resolve a problem in a timely manner.

20-06-185 Roaming Cats

Deputy Mayor Locke advised that roaming domestic cats also have a negative impact on the bird population. He reiterated that cats are to be tethered when outside.

20-06-186 Appreciation to Staff

Councillor Ledwell extended appreciation to staff and all public servants to ensure citizens are provided the services they need.

20-06-187 Vehicle Break-Ins

Councillor Fry commented on the social media posts she has seen regarding vehicle break-ins in various neighbourhoods and questioned how the City could address the problem. Director Collins advised there was an active RNC investigation and the Municipal Enforcement Division is providing assistance. The benefits of the Neighbourhood Watch Program were raised, and it was suggested that residents contact the City for further information.

20-06-188 National Blood Donor Week

Councillor Power noted that National Blood Donor Week was June 8-14 and spoke on the importance of lifesaving blood donations. She noted that donations continue to be accepted and collected in compliance with the public health guidelines.

20-06-189 Stroke Awareness Month

Councillor Power advised that June is Stroke Awareness Month and encouraged residents to visit the Heart and Stroke website for potentially lifesaving information.

20-06-190 <u>Father's Day</u>

Councillor Power noted that Father's Day was Sunday (June 21) and extended best wishes to all fathers.
