21-08-451 <u>Fundraiser – Food Bank</u>

Councillor Antle extended appreciation to residents Alexander Taylor and Claire Hutchings on their recent fundraiser concert in support of the food bank.

21-08-452 <u>Increased Traffic, Speeding – Smallwood Drive and Park Avenue</u>

Members of Council spoke on the increased traffic and speeding on Smallwood Drive and Park Avenue which can partly be attributed to accessing the Team Gushue Highway. Consideration is being to traffic calming measures such as calming lanes, increased municipal enforcement presence, reduced speed limits, and speed humps. It is hoped that this action will redirect traffic to Topsail Road, Mount Carson Avenue, and Old Placentia Road. The importance of the completion of the Team Gushue Avenue was noted along with the support of the City's MHAs.

21-08-453 <u>Legal Costs</u>

Members of Council addressed the cost of legal services incurred since launching the 2019 investigation into allegations against the former CAO as well as the allegations of misconduct by the former CAO and former Councillors. It was noted that the City will continue to make these costs public to ensure transparency for the information of residents. A report from the investigator is anticipated in the coming weeks. It was also noted that despite the money spent on legal services the City is in a good financial position. Council is committed to employees and ensuring a respectful workplace.

21-08-454 Walking Trails

Deputy Mayor Locke commented on the walking trails and the new wayfinding signs.

21-08-455 Fewer Taxis

Deputy Mayor Locke requested that staff investigate whether fewer taxis has impacted ridership on Metrobus and the GoBus service.

21-08-456 Association for Arts in Mount Pearl (AAMP) – Bracelet-Making Activity

Councillor Fry extended appreciation to the Association for organizing a pop-up bracelet-making activity.

21-08-457 Movie in the Park

Councillor Fry provided details on the upcoming movie being held on August 25 at St. David's Park.

21-08-458 Admiralty House Communications Museum

Councillor Fry advised that the Museum is seeking a new Chair of their Volunteer Board of Management. Further details are available on their website. Appreciation was extended to outgoing Chair, John Riche, for his nine years of service.

21-08-459 Grow Getter

Councillor Fry provided information on the City's pilot project that will allow residents and organizations to adopt public green spaces. Further details are available on the City website.

Councillor Fry commented on the baskets and planters seen throughout the City and expressed appreciation to the horticulturist on staff, Michael Kelleher.
