#### INFRASTRUCTURE AND PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE

#### 22-03-096 Operational Updates

Councillor Rice provided an update on ongoing snow clearing, ice control and weekly bulk garbage collection appointments. Also noted was the preparation of annual City maintenance tenders for 2022, and ongoing winter maintenance in all facilities.

Councillor Rice offered thanks and congratulations to the IPW staff on a job well done with snow clearing in the City noting that recent, varying weather conditions have made the work difficult and advising residents to use extra caution in parking lots and entrances as they are managed after street clearing work is completed.

## 22-03-097 <u>Capital Projects – Status Updates</u>

Councillor Rice provided an update on capital projects such as the new Civic Centre and St. David's Smart Accessible Playground.

Councillor Antle asked if the date of August 5<sup>th</sup> for completion for St. David's was firm and wondered if they could coincide completion with Mount Pearl City Days. The IPW Director noted the completion date was provided by contractor based on delivery and supply of materials, but he would inquire about possibility.

#### 22-03-110 Notice of Motion – Amendment to Rules of Procedure

Deputy Mayor Kieley gave notice that she would, at a regular meeting of Council, move to amend the text of the City of Mount Pearl's Rules of Procedure that, if enacted, will:

#### 1. Under Section 4.6

 delete "following completion with a statement to the effect that such minutes are not the official transcript, which can only be provided following their adoption at the next meeting of Council" and replace with "following their adoption at a public meeting of Council.".

The section would then read: "Minutes of the Public Council Meeting will be placed on the City's website within three (3) working days following their adoption at a public meeting of Council."

- 2. Throughout the Rules of Procedure, make any secondary/grammatical edits required to effectively incorporate the changes described under 1 above.
- 3. Throughout the Rules of Procedure, make any other correction/formatting required edits that may be identified, i.e., typos, and which do not alter any intent of the current Rules of Procedure.

The purpose of this amendment is to ensure that the public is presented with an accurate and complete set of council minutes from the respective public council meeting in a timely manner.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### 22-03-111 International Woman's Day

Councillor members wished female Council and staff a Happy International Woman's Day and recognized the strong women who influenced them and who made significant strides in the promotion of equality and leadership for women and girls

Mayor Aker, Councillors Rice, Locke and Antle noted the strength, intelligence, and work of their female colleagues on City Council, and City staff. They noted that council and staff would continue to work to keep an open mind and break the bias.

The CAO noted it was great to be part of a team that is breaking the bias. She offered her commitment to continue this work.
