Guidelines

Who is eligible?

The Foundation will provide funds to formal and informal groups, non-profit and charitable organizations, community-based groups, public sector and neighbourhood associations that are incorporated as not-for-profit agencies. The Foundation will consider funding projects under the following criteria:

- Those focused on "youth helping youth" empowering youth through new and innovative opportunities.
- For young people up to the age of 19 years.
- Those involving partnerships.
- Those promoting enriching opportunities for growth through creative activities, youth programs and community involvement.
- Those that encourage youth to develop a lifelong commitment to education and learning.
- Those that provide youth opportunities for the development of strong values that guide their choices.

The Foundation may finance fundraising efforts on behalf of or in partnership with qualified organizations. Joint fundraising initiatives may also be considered.

Limitations

The Foundation will provide timelimited project funding only. The Foundation will not provide ongoing operational funding and grants will be limited to a maximum of up to 20% of funds available. Groups can be approved more than once and for more than one project.

Individuals and ad hoc groups without not-for-profit incorporated status are not eligible for support. However, the Foundation can consider funding through a fiscal agent provided the agent has not-for-profit and/or charitable status.

Applications


First time applications for funding must be accompanied by a complete application form including the most recent annual report, financial statements and proof of not-for-profit incorporation and/or charitable status.
