22-08-440 <u>Farrell Drive Upgrading between Holden Street and Evans Place - Water,</u>
Sanitary/Storm Sewer, Asphalt, Curb, and Sidewalk Replacement (17-Gl-21-00044)

- Contract Recommendation

Motion: Councillor Rice/Councillor Fry

RESOLVED THAT, the contract be awarded to Dexter Construction Company Limited for Farrell Drive (Holden to Evans Section) Upgrading Project (Project Number 17-GI-21-00044) for the bid amount of \$7,096,765.00 (HST included).

Question called – Motion carried unanimously.

Councillor Locke asked for a time frame for completion of the work. The PED Director noted that design information would be submitted and reviewed first, but the overall timeframe would be approximately two years depending on what is found when the work commences and the weather.

The Deputy Mayor inquired about the relationship between this work and the City's asset management plan. The PED Director noted that the service life of the infrastructure in the area has expired and this work will help to renew the infrastructure for a significant period of time. The PED Director also noted that the work would be designed to accommodate climate changes and will help to lay infrastructure which will support the planned expansion in the Northlands area.

22-08-441 Sale of City Land (Commonwealth Avenue Backland)

RESOLVED THAT, the city will move forward with the sale of a portion of city land, in the amount of \$46,000 and the signing of an MOU. The developer is required to submit a formal development application for review as part of the MOU.

22-08-450 Congratulations

Councillor Rice noted that Alex's grandfather was one of the founders of the Men's Recreational Hockey League in Mount Pearl.

22-08-453 'Block the Bus' Event

Deputy Mayor Kieley extended thanks to Pipers for their 'Fill the Bus' event in aid of the Association of New Canadians whereby people came and donated supplies to fill a school bus. The Deputy Mayor noted the importance of the organization and the support they provide to individuals and families coming to the province from other countries. She encouraged residents to participate in other opportunities for this type of event noting that school season was approaching.

Councillor Antle offered congratulations to Gary Martin who was appointed Team NL's Assistant Chef de Mission for the 2023 Canada Games.
