22-11-628 Payment Register and Purchase Card Report

For the information of Council, the following payment register for October 27 – November 8, 2022, totaled \$ 1,689,065.24. The purchase card report for September 26-October 25, 2022 totaled \$ 194,714.25.

Councillor Antle asked for clarification on the multiple payments to the same vendors. The PED Director advised that these charges were related to life safety inspections and fire extinguisher inspections which are completed annually and may also include, as a part of those inspections, replacement equipment.

Councillor Fry asked for clarification on duplicate charges for another vendor. The Manager of Finance advised these were related to gift card purchases for gas for city vehicles during the labour disruption as some employees do not have PCards for gas purchase. The Manager of Finance also noted that the dates listed are invoice dates, not the date on which the charge was incurred.

Councillor Rice also asked for clarification on multiple payments paid to the same vendor. The Manager of Finance advised these were landscaping deposit returns. Councillor Rice also requested clarification on an amount relating to reefer repair services. The PW Director reported that the City was awaiting delivery of two loaders tendered from the previous year and this charge was related to the delivery of same.

22-11-632 Remembrance Day Wreath Laying Ceremony and Parade

Councillor Lane along with other Council members attended the Parade and Wreath Laying Ceremony at St. David's on Friday November 11, 2022. She recognized the importance of the event and noted she was glad to see the large number of people who attended this year.

22-11-633 Congratulations

Councillor Lane offered congratulations to the recipients of the upcoming Mount Pearl Soccer Association Hall of Fame Awards. She highlighted the awards for Coach of the Year, the 2022 Dave LeGrow Youth Female Player of the Year and the Neil Bodman Youth Male Player of the Year,

22-11-634 Power's Pond Lighting Update

Councillor Fry asked for an update on the lighting issues in Power's Pond trails. The PW Director noted it was an electrical power supply issue and PW is working the PED electrical contractor to resolve.

22-11-635 Mount Pearl Community Supper

Councillor Fry noted the Community Supper would be resuming on Wednesday, November 23.5-6 pm at the Church of the Good Shepherd. She advised that hot meals were available to any who may need them but they would be takeout only.

Councillor Fry acknowledged the efforts of the Mount Pearl Minor Hockey Association for the fundraising efforts for local food banks. She noted they raised \$13,500.00 and gave special thanks to Tanna Clarke and her team for organizing the drive and for teaching the City's youth the importance of volunteerism.

22-11-637 MNL Conference

Councillor Fry noted that she and other Council members attended the MNL Conference in Gander, NL from November 2-5, 2022. She noted the important discussions on infrastructure, clean drinking water, housing, and climate change. She highlighted the presentation by the Mayors of Port aux Basques and Grand Falls Windsor in relation to recent disasters.

Deputy Mayor Kieley also spoke of the value and importance of the conference. She noted specifically discussions on climate change and gender-based analysis and the City's lead role in the discussions

The Mayor also acknowledged the leadership role taken by the City in a session at the conference.

22-11-638 5th Annual Santa for Seniors

The Deputy Mayor highlighted this event which was provides assistance to the many seniors in the city who will be alone during the holidays. She stated that this community endeavor brings care and connection along with gifts and noted that volunteers were collecting and compiling donations at St. Vincent de Paul. She encouraged residents to donate if they are able or to reach out if they know of a senior who would benefit from the initiative and to check on their elderly neighbours over the holidays.

Councilor Rice also acknowledged that seniors may be struggling with the cost of living especially at this time of year. He asked residents to be mindful of those in the community who may need help during the holiday season.

Councillor Antle offered condolences to the family of Herb Jenkins on the passing of their loved one. He noted Mr. Jenkins' valuable contributions to Mount Pearl sport associations.

Councillor Antle reported that Craig Dyer was elected president of MPSA. He also noted the upcoming Hall of Fame Award ceremony on Saturday, November 19.

22-11-641 Sensory Friendly Swim

Councillor Antle provided information for the public on the sensory friendly swims available at the Summit Centre on Saturday evenings.

22-11-642 Clean Trails

Councillor Antle reminded residents to pick up after pets when walking on the trails. He
