NEW BUSINESS

23-09-498 Octoberfest. - Reid Centre October 6 – 7, 2023

Councillor Antle noted the following for the information of the public:

On Friday, October 6th from 7-10pm, the City will host a Craft Beer Tasting featuring some of the provinces craft breweries.

On Saturday, October 7th from 6-10pm, the City will host Rocktoberfest with music by Bic and the Ballpoints and Sugar. Landwash Brewery will be serving beverages and venders such as Cojones, Presto and Ziggy Food trucks will be on site for food purchases.

23-09-499 Fall Craft Fair October 9 – Reid Centre

Councillor Rice advised the annual Fall Craft Fair will take place on October 9 from 10 am to 4pm at the Reid Centre.

23-09-500 Sunset yoga – On the T'rail

Councillor Rice advised that Sunset Yoga had been rescheduled to September 21 from 6 pm - 7 pm.

23-09-501 Construction Zones

Councillor Rice noted there were many areas of construction in the city and asked that motorists abide by signage for safety and adhere to direction of flag persons. He advised safety was the main concern for the City and asked that motorists slow down in these areas.

23-09-502 Babysitting Course

Councillor Lane provided a reminder to residents that online registration opened today for the October 15 babysitting course at the Reid Centre. She noted additional information could be found on the City's website and Facebook page and encouraged residents to sign up for the course.

23-09-503 Playgroup Fall 2023

Councillor Lane advised the City is offering a staff led parent and tot play group each Saturday from 10 to11:30 am at the Reid Centre at a cost of \$5.00 per child. All details will be provided on the City's website and Facebook page.

23-09-504 Mount Pearl Library Events

Councillor Fry reminded residents of the Mount Pearl Library's' many offerings and events. She noted in particular, the Paws for Stories with St. John Ambulance Therapy Dogs coming to the library and children could read stories to them.

23-09-505 Property at Smallwood and Commonwealth Intersection Update

Councillor Fry asked for an update on the status of this property /dwelling as a resident had reached out to her. The Manager of Planning advised City Inspectors had been engaged to monitor the property and violations had been issued, one as early as today. She also noted that demolition of the dwelling would take place in the Spring.

23-09-506 TD Bank Tree Planting

The Mayor acknowledged TD Bank for their support with the tree planting program in the City by supplying approximately 130 trees and bushes for the City's annual Tree Day. He also acknowledged and thanked PW and RCS staff, and volunteers for preparing the beds for planting.

23-09-506 Updates for Canada Games 2024.

The Director of Recreation and Community Safety updated Council on the joint effort with all departments to get the process of installing the clay for Team Gushue Field started. He noted a lot of the clay arrived and should be in place this week. He reported that a representative of Baseball Canada was present and was impressed with surface upgrades. The Director also noted the clay supplier, Halifax Seed, would be in the City next week and will work with staff and the Baseball Association to advise how to build mounds and maintain clay.
