# Winter Tips \*\*

Winter in Mount Pearl is a beautiful time, and with the right information and preparation, you can make the most of it while staying safe. Whether you're tracking plows, learning about regulations, or enjoying the snowy trails, this guide has you covered. Stay informed, stay safe, and embrace the magic of a Mount Pearl winter!

### **SNOW CLEARING REGULATIONS**

Mount Pearl residents are encouraged to be mindful of snow clearing regulations to ensure a smooth snow season for all, including:

- **No Street Parking:** From December 1 to March 31 each year, no vehicles are allowed to be parked on any street within the city between 1:00 am and 8:00 am.
- **During a Storm:** While the snow or ice is falling and for 12 hours afterward, street parking is a no-go.
- **Shoveling Snow:** It's essential to keep driveways and parking lots clear, but never shovel or plow snow onto the streets, carriage ways, or sidewalks within the city.

These guidelines are in place to ensure our plows can do their work safely and efficiently. Violators may face fines for non-compliance, so make sure to review the official snow clearing regulations to avoid any issues.



### **SNOW PLOW TRACKER**

Ever wonder when the plow will clear your street? Mount Pearl's Snow Plow Tracker comes to the rescue! This interactive map lets you follow city vehicles as they work to keep the roads safe and clear. You can even see where they've been in the past 2, 4, 12, and 24 hours. It's like having a personal snow clearing GPS!



### WEATHER INFORMATION CENTRE

The Weather Information Centre is your one-stop resource for everything you need to know about adverse weather. This valuable resource provides tips on how to prepare for winter storms, links to relevant authorities, and the latest information on closures and service impacts.

#### **TRAILS**

Winter doesn't mean you have to stay indoors. The city grooms parts of its trail system for walking, snowshoeing, and crosscountry skiing, offering residents a fantastic winter wonderland.



### **MAILBOXES**

If you find your mailbox surrounded by snow, preventing you from accessing your mail, don't fret. Create a service ticket with Canada Post by visiting their website or calling 1-866-607-6301.



### **WINTER DAMAGE**

In case your property is damaged as a result of city snow clearing equipment, fill out an online form to request a repair. Remember, the city doesn't repair damages due to large amounts of snow, nor does it repair damages to structures in residential yards.





Winter is a time for kids to have fun, but it's vital to keep them safe near snow plows and clearing equipment.
Our winter safety mascot, Safey
Snowplow, leads the city's program to teach K-6 kids important safety tips.

- Play well away from the roads.
   Backyards are perfect for building snowmen and snow sculptures.
- Snow plows like Safey are big and take extra time to stop, so give them plenty of space.
- Wear bright clothing so drivers can see you playing.
- Take a hot chocolate break indoors when you get too cold or wet!
- When sliding, always ride on your knees or backside, and face forward.
   Slide one at a time to avoid banging into another sledder.
- Playing in the snow is more fun with a buddy! Play with a friend and look out for each other.



# Citizen Alert

Sign up for alerts to be in the know about what is happening in our city.

Stay connected! Citizen Alert is a tool that provides communication from the city directly to you, our residents. By signing up, we'll keep you in the loop on emergencies, service interruptions, and more!

Citizen Alerts may include, but are not limited to:

- Garbage/recycling collection schedule changes or cancellations
- Major construction projects
- Emergency communications (e.g. severe weather, major fire)
- Severe traffic disruptions
- Watermain breaks that affect a large area
- Boil order advisories

### How will you be notified?

You can receive notifications through phone calls, text messages, and/or emails.

### What if your neighbourhood is not affected?

Citizen Alert uses a Geographic Information system where an alert can be tailored to a particular area in the city. For example, for garbage/recycling schedule changes, only individuals along the affected route will be notified. For other alerts, such as weather emergencies, all residents who signed up for Citizen Alert will be notified.

### YOUTH OPPORTUNITY FUND FOUNDATION



# Municipal Enforcement



Our Municipal Enforcement Team is steadfast in their commitment to bolstering community safety. They strive to improve overall well-being, with the aim of making our city an even better place to live.

### THEIR ROLE

Our officers play a vital role in:

- Safeguarding property
- Upholding peace within the community
- Proactively addressing, identifying, and investigating violations of regulations
- Enforcing the provisions outlined in the City of Mount Pearl Act, as well as relevant provincial legislation such as the Animal Health and Protection Act and the ATV/Motorized Snow Vehicle Act
- Collaborating with the Royal Newfoundland Constabulary (RNC) in the identification and investigation of both criminal and non-criminal offenses
- Providing assistance to citizens during emergency situations
- Fulfilling the role of Peace Officers in a community-oriented policing setting.

### **COMMUNITY OUTREACH**

Our officers participate in many outreach initiatives and committees:

- Sit on the Mount Pearl Citizens Crime Prevention Committee
- Assist with the Law Enforcement Torch Run
- Fundraising for several charities and food drives.
- Halloween Safety Skeleton patrol
- Safety presentations to schools and daycares
- Graffiti reduction programs
- Crime prevention lunch and learns

# Mount Pearl Summit Centre 🕢

The Mount Pearl Summit Centre is a state-of-the-art recreation facility. It houses a 25,000 square foot aquatics complex with two swimming pools and a slide, fitness centre (gym, weight room, cardio room, indoor walking track), a gymnasium, and various multi-purpose rooms.

# How does it work?





Place recyclables in transparent blue bags



Place household garbage in **clear** bags and place in cart



Two small privacy bags are allowed per cart



Place recycling and garbage cart at the curb

### CART PLACEMENT

### **PARK IT**

Place cart on the street with the wheels against the curb.



### **POINT IT**

Arrows on the cart should point to the centre of the road.



**SPACE IT** 

Give at least an arm's-length of clearance on all sides.



If you live on Ruth Avenue, Commonwealth Avenue or Topsail Road, please place cart at the end of your driveway.

#### Please note:

- Garbage must be placed inside a cart provided by the city.
- Carts must be placed at the curb by 8 a.m. on your collection day.
- Carts should not be placed at the curb on the evening prior to your collection day.
- Cart lid must be completely closed.
- Cart weight should not exceed 136kg (300lbs).
- Two small, non-transparent bags (for disposal of sensitive material) are allowed per cart on each collection day. Privacy bags must be no larger than 54.9 cm x 58.4 cm  $(21.6 \text{ in } \times 23 \text{ in}).$

#### Instructions for winter collection:

- You may need to adjust cart placement so that it does not interfere with snowplows.
- Find a clear space and place your cart as close to the street as possible, without obstructing the street or sidewalk. Remember, the arm on the collection truck can only reach a maximum of 10 feet.
- Do not place cart behind or on top of snow banks. Make sure it is visible and accessible.
- Once garbage has been collected, return your cart to a secure location on your property.
- Please use discretion when placing recyclables out for collection on windy days. You may consider holding them until the following week.

# Your Schedule

Regular household garbage and recycling is collected once a week, from Tuesday to Friday, with each street receiving collection on a specific day. To view your regular collection day and bulk garbage collection day, please refer to the following two pages.

#### **BULK GARBAGE COLLECTION**

Prescheduled bulk garbage collection takes place in May and June. Collection takes place on Mondays and may take up to one week to complete. To determine your bulk collection day, please refer to the table to the right and the following pages.

If you require collection at any other time, you may request a special service (Mondays only) for a pre-paid fee of \$25. To learn more, call 748-1000.

#### Wood waste

E.g. trees, branches, and small logs. Must be a diameter of 6 inches or less. a length of 4 feet or less, and neatly bundled and tied and free of the following:

- Construction or building materials.
- Anything that contains dirt, sand, gravel, rocks, metal (nails, screws, fencing) or other human-made materials
- Wood waste that is lumber, fence posts, signs, roots, stumps, or anything that grows below the soil

Other bulk garbage items Normally associated with household

Construction/building materials Concrete Landscaping materials Oil products Auto parts With or without rims Any items with nails not removed Loose materials not boxed, bundled, or placed in clear bags

### Other guidelines

- You MUST separate metals from other bulk garbage.
- Bulk items must not be placed to the curb until the evening before the scheduled pick-up day.
- Items must be placed at the curb by 8 a.m. on your collection day.
- Loose materials must not exceed 22kg (50 lbs).
- Items not intended for bulk collection should be removed from the curb.
