PROCLAMATIONS

24-05-231 Multiple Sclerosis (MS) Awareness Month - May 2024

The Mayor signed a proclamation declaring the month of May as Multiple Sclerosis (MS) Awareness Month in the City of Mount Pearl.

Ms. Zita Kavanagh-Taylor attended and spoke to the proclamation. She told her story of living with MS, providing information on the disease and background on their organization, the S'Myelin Warriors Newfoundland Labrador. She discussed the importance to understand MS and to raise awareness.

A walk is taking place on May 11th, Paws for MS. This is the 10th year anniversary for this walk and this year they are partnering with Critters and Things. Everyone was encouraged to attend, and walk your pet for this cause. Further, this year they are also partnering with Mental Health, and are providing donations to this organization as MS affects mental health of those living with MS.

Zita thanked Council for the support. Council members acknowledged the important work of these volunteers in raising awareness of MS and thanked Zita for sharing her personal story, and for being an advocate for those living with MS. City Hall will be lit red tonight in support.
