RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SAFETY

25-02-060 Community Public Safety Plan Update

The City remains committed to making Mount Pearl a safer place. Municipal Enforcement Officers continue to patrol streets, parks, trails, and other city areas. Quarterly Municipal Enforcement statistics will be posted on the City's website. The City is also recruiting community members to join the Community Public Safety Steering Committee. Additionally, City staff meet bi-weekly with officials from the Department of Justice and Public Safety to complete Mount Pearl's Community Safety and Wellness Plan.

Council questioned recruitment of community members. Clarification was provided that the City staff are working with the Department of Justice in the recruitment of key

stakeholders for a steering committee, including representation from education, health care, social services and RNC sectors. The public was assured that the City, Department of Justice, and the RNC are actively working and engaged in public safety in the community, with the first committee meeting scheduled to take place mid-February.

Rational for grant reduction was provided, to ensure that funding is available for future applications. Tiny homes were questioned, and it was clarified that applications are required to meet the City's municipal plan and regulations as it relates to zoning.

A status update for Public Works was provided. Winter shift schedules are underway, and work continues on the outdoor rinks. Three outdoor skating rinks are currently open at Team Gushue Sports Complex, Murley Drive, and Montclair Street; and, schedule and information can be found on the City's website. Trail maintenance is ongoing and prep work for the Frosty Festival has begun in the Parks Division. Service and maintenance continue, and winter equipment maintenance is ongoing in the Fleet Division. Information was provided on UTM general calls, water and sewer repairs, and water levels at Bay Bulls Big Pond as of January 27, 2025 were attached for information.
